

Intelligent Class Is Dying Out

(By United Press.)
Berkeley, Cal., Dec. 16.—Drawing his conclusions from figures taken over a period of five years from 3,350 families sending children to college, Professor S. J. Holmes, University of California, believes the "intelligent class" is dying out.

The figures disclose that this class is being reduced at a rate of 30 per cent each generation, he said.

"The present family size of our 'intelligent' human being is, far below what is necessary for maintaining the stock," he declared.

"Rightly computed, the average gifted family has only 2.18 children. When we take into account those gifted families having no children, which is not included in the 2.18 per cent, the figure may drop as low as 1.80."

PLAY DAM IS BUILT AT EXPENSE \$110,000

Fresno, Cal., Dec. 16.—High in the Sierra mountains near here a "play" dam has been constructed to a height of 60 feet, at a cost of \$110,000, and is attracting the attention of noted construction engineers throughout the world. It was built for no other purpose than to be pounded down into Stevenson canyon under the force of hundreds of tons of water, and to prove to science the exact amount of man-made material needed to store a given amount of water.

Funds for the project were con-

tributed by 50 banking, engineering and power firms. Professor Charles D. Marx, Stanford university, heads the committee of the Engineering Foundation of New York under whose auspices the experiment is being made.

The dam is 100 feet long and two feet thick. Construction started last June. At its 60-foot height it still held the water back. Professor Marx believes it can be built 50 feet higher without crushing.

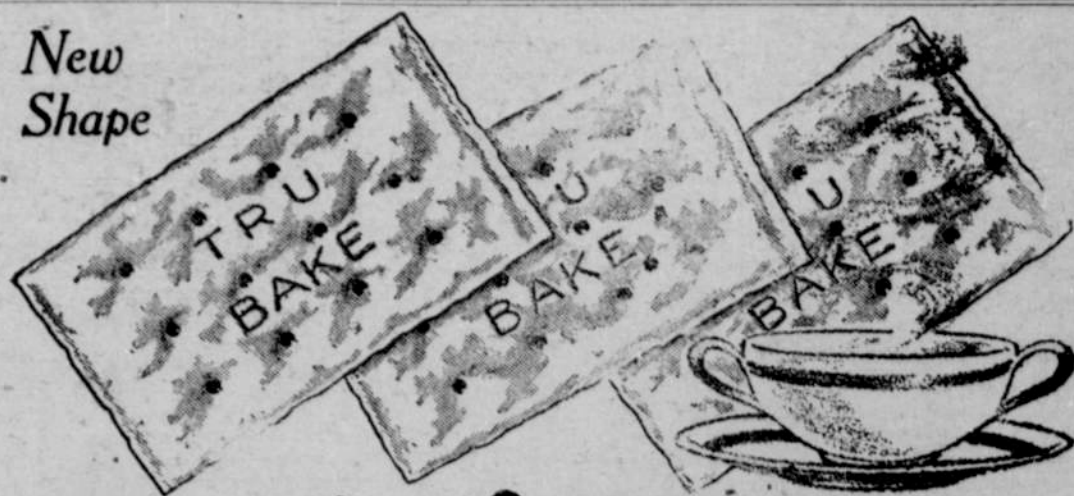
