Land Office to Open To Entry 23,000 Acres

ROSEBURG, Jan. 20.—Notice has been given that about 23,000 acres of reversioned Oregon and California grant lands and Coos Bay wagon road grant lands in this district will be opened to entry under the homestead law on March 15, 1927, according to announcement of the United States land office.

Ex-service men of the late war with Germany may begin filing applications on February 23, 1927, and all applications filed from that date to and including March 14, 1927, will be considered as filed at the same time, and a drawing had for all conflicting applications.

Printed pamphlets, containing descriptions of the lands to be opened, and regulations governing the opening and costs of filing will be received at the local land office at Roseburg about February 1 and can be had upon request.

DISPOSAL LAND GRANT MONEYS BILL SUBJECT

If there should be any indebtedness not yet payable, the bill would provide that the funds shall be invested against the time that the indebtedness shall become due.
