

San Joaquin Valley Gets Air Line Beacons

FRESNO, Cal., July 20.—(U.P.)—An air line with beacons at ten-mile intervals will be in operation throughout the length of San Joaquin valley within six months, according to A. L. Curtis, federal airways extension superintendent.

addition there will be 3,000,000 candle power electric beacons mounted on fifty-foot steel towers to guide night flyers. Giant arrows built of concrete and lying beneath the beacons will indicate the direction of the course. The arrow will bear the number of the course and flyers will select their routes as the motorist now chooses trunk highways. The new service will be available to all flyers, civilian and commercial.

Court Decision May Put State in Real Tangle

Oregon May Not Be Permitted to Pay Bills With Own Money.

SALEM, July 20.—Because it is believed the opinion of the supreme court recently nullifying an act of the 1927 legislature whereby the state would be authorized to build a \$600,000 office building with funds borrowed from the state accident commission will throw state finances into an extremely chaotic condition, it was virtually decided by the state board of control today to ask for a rehearing of the case.

Smokers Cause Heavy Damage in the Forests

The number of forest fires caused by carelessness or thoughtlessness of smokers is increasing, according to the forest service. This increase is strikingly shown by 126 such fires in 1922 and 281 in 1926.

Forest rangers reported 1222 smokers' fires from the twenty-two national forests in Oregon and Washington for the 11-year period, 1914-1926. Five and a half per cent of all fires reported were due to smokers and such fires were responsible for 12 per cent of the cost of fire fighting in these two states.

Remington Portable

47 Arrests Six Months For Liquor Violations

Forty-seven arrests for violations of liquor laws were made in Lane county during the first six months of 1927 by operatives of the National Law Enforcement league, according to a semi-annual report made public yesterday by L. M. Kletzing, field manager. The number was the highest for any place covered by the operatives. Tillamook was second with 43. The total number of arrests for the state was 129.

Of the 47 arrested in Lane county, 42 were convicted, one acquitted, three cases dismissed and one case is still pending. Fines assessed in the local cases totalled \$5935 and jail sentences totalled 785 days. Of the 129 cases in the state, 110 convictions were listed, one acquittal, 13 dismissals and five are still pending. The sum of \$15,290 in fines was collected and sentences totalled 1645 days.

April was the big month for arrests by operatives in Lane county, 14 having been made in that month. January was next with 10, May had 8, February 7, June 6 and March 2.

Escape Aid Is Charged.

Charged with aiding a fellow prisoner to escape, E. E. Breazeale and G. A. McGillivray, Lane county prisoners, were arraigned Tuesday in justice court in Eugene and bound over to the grand jury. Both entered pleas of not guilty to aiding Albert Pierce, alleged drug addict, in escaping through a hole in the wall of the county jail Friday night.

Both men are now serving sentences for liquor violations. It is they, officers allege, who became lodged in the small breach through which Pierce escaped and were helped back into the jail.
