Local Schools Make Attendance Record

The percentage of daily attendance in the grades and high school for the past school year was the highest ever made during the seven years that O. W. Hays has been school superintendent here, according to a report just issued by the superintendent's office. The percentage of attendance for the high school for 1927-28 was 96.7 per cent and for the grades it was 97.3 per cent.

It was pointed out that there were no contagious disease scares during the past year to cut down attendance. In the grades the percentage of attendance fell below 96 during but one month. That was in January when the percentage was 95.4. This was due to the fear of infantile paralysis at that time.

The average daily attendance in the high school was 197.4 and in the grades it was 501.2. Total enrollment in the high school for the entire year was 249 and for the grades 630.

The number in Cottage Grove school district No. 45 between the ages of 4 and 21 was 1026, according to the last school census. During the year members of the board made 46 visits to the schools and parents made 260 visits.
