Educational Plan

A land grant college is an educational institution which derives at least a part of its income from the sales and rentals of lands granted to the various states for educational purposes. There have been several land grant laws. The most important one, however, was passed about 1860. This law gave to each state 30,000 acres of land per representative. In this way if a state had 100 representatives, it would have 3,000,000 acres of land, the income of which was to be used in supporting a free education institution for the people of that state. Practically all the state universities have been built on this land grant basis, and there may be other institutions in the state such as technical and industrial schools which are practically supported in this manner also.
