Green Feed for Poultry

Green feeds keep the digestive tract in good condition and furnish certain minerals and vitamins necessary for good health, for good egg production, and especially for good fertility in the hatching eggs.

In summer the hens ranging about the farm get a generous supply of green feed. If the hens are yarded, arrangements should be made whereby the yards can be changed from time to time, and good green feed crops grown.

Rape grows easily and supplies abundant green feed of high quality for late fall.

Kale and mustard rank high and

are much used on the Pacific coast.

For small flocks, especially in towns where growing space for green feed is limited, winter chard is one of the best. It is a "cut-and-come-again" crop, so a small patch will furnish green feed all summer long.

Cut clover and alfalfa make excellent green feed. Cabbage is unusually good and has the advantage of being easily stored.

Mangels and carrots cannot rank as green feed but they add variety and succulence to the winter ration and are easily grown and easily stored.

Remember, that green feed, especially for the breeding stock, means green-leaved plants. No doubt the best green feed stands-by of poultry raisers is sprouted oats.

Sprouted oats plus cabbage is an excellent combination for breeding hens. When sprouted oats are fed, the whole grain should be omitted from the scratch ration. The oats are usually fed when the sprouts are about half an inch long. This gives the best feeding value of the starchy part of the grain plus a little green leafy material. The results however a little cabbage should supplement them.

Wooden buckets can be used for sprouting the oats. Bore a hole in the bottom and put in a plug.

One bucket of oats each day will feed the average farm flock.

Soak the oats for 24 hours in the basement or near some source of heat. Drain off the water and stir through it. Keep it in a warm place and in six to seven days the oats will be ready to feed.

Each day put to soak a new bucket and stir the buckets that are already starting to sprout.

If mold bothers, use one tablespoon of formalin to each pint of water. Formalin in this quantity will not be injurious to the hens.

But this time we think we'll omit our philosophizing and give some recipes which may prove excellent for both of you!

Tamale Loaf.
One cup hamburger or ground meat, 2 eggs, 1 can corn (small), 1 cup cup yellow cornmeal, 1 cup cup ripe olives—sliced, 1 cup canned tomatoes, 1 tablespoon chili powder, 1 clove minced garlic, 1 teaspoon salt, 1/4 teaspoon pepper. Mix together all ingredients. Shape in loaf in casserole. Bake in greased with bacon drippings or butter. Bake at 350 degrees for about 40 minutes. Serve hot with the following sauce: Melt 1 or 2 tablespoons bacon drippings or oil, and add flour (1 tablespoon to a cup of liquid), minced garlic, tomato juice and spanish pepper to taste. Cook until fairly thick.

Noodles and Ham au Gratin.
(What to do with that leftover ham.)
Two cups cooked noodles, 2-3 cup grated cheese, 2 cups cooked ham chopped, 2 cups thin white sauce. Put layer of noodles in greased casserole. Add layer of ham and well seasoned white sauce and sprinkle with cheese. Repeat. Sprinkle cheese on top. Bake in moderate oven (350 degrees) for about 30 minutes.
