Highlander's Apparel

The Highlander costume consists of a short tunic, vest and belt, heavily pleated, passing around the waist and reaching not quite to the knees. Short trousers are worn under this tunic. The stockings are gartered below the knee and low shoes are worn with the costume. In front, hanging from a belt around the waist, is a sash, a pocketbook purse covered with fur, and a large plaid or scarf is wrapped around the body, the ends hanging down from a brooch fastened on the left shoulder. The headgear is a cloth cap or bonnet in which a sprig of heather is stuck, or in the case of a chief, an eagle's feather. The distinguishing feature of the costume is the tartan.
