

OUR BANNER CROPS.

Have you driven down the Willamette valley recently, either the east or west side route? If you have, you have observed evidences in the roadside fields of crops that must equal the best of fertile regions elsewhere.—Eugene Register.

Yep, this writer drove down the Willamette valley a few days ago and saw exactly the same things that the Register writer saw. The day was a Sunday and the crops were so good that everywhere the thirty husbandmen was out gathering them.

And we noted something else that the Register overlooked, at least does not mention. We heard the clatter of combines and binders, we saw great loads of grain being hauled away, we saw vehicles carrying the husbandman from place to place on his farm, but not in a single instance did we see a team of horses being used.

A tractor about the size of one mule was chugging along with each combine or binder, gasoline motor trucks hauled the grain away and a motor driven vehicle carried the husbandman about his place. Several hundred head of horses or mules would have been used in the old day to perform the work that we saw being done on this Sunday.

Probably a hundred more men would have been employed in the old days to handle the animals.

What is the price of oats today? About the same as the price of a gallon of gas.

What are the wages of men? In this off year they are not much greater than was sometimes paid in the good old days, but motor driven machinery has made their working day much shorter.

Men handling motor driven machinery, men working short work days do not eat nearly so much as they did in the good old days. Cooking for a threshing crew isn't the job that it used to be.

With motor driven machinery and patent fertilizers, production has been greatly speeded up at the same time that consumption has decreased.

Here is a new condition that has come upon us almost without warning, and with all the complaining that has been done we haven't heard a word from any farm organization about the tremendous profits of the oil companies to which the farmers are adding millions with their motor driven machinery and vehicles.

Life for the farmer has been made easier, and the two may well employ their spare time figuring out a way to drive their machinery with their own products, as they did when they used mules and horses. If they can't do this, any other way of increasing consumption to a point that will absorb the surplus will do. The surplus is no greater than the decreased consumption by men and animals on the farms.

As much as we like Ed Bailey, democratic nominee for governor, we have never supported him for any office, and are not likely to now other than to call attention to the fact that Cottage Grove has reason to remember him for the part he played in putting over our armory bill, but we shall defend him whenever he is unfairly attacked, as he was by the convention of mavericks who placed Julius Meier in nomination as an independent candidate. The platform adopted by the meeting declared Bailey to be a protégé of the power trust. Ed may be a lot of things, but the thing he isn't the most is a protégé of the power interests. Although this is a rabid republican newspaper, we should dislike very much to see Ed lose a vote because of this preposterous assertion by a convention which had no excuse for its being. Ed may never be governor, but he will always be clean, and we are not so certain we can say that about all those who had a hand in framing the independent platform.



PROFIT ON DEBTS.
Money is easily borrowed but hard to pay back. Over a term of years the interest equals the principal. This means that in many cases the improvement cost that it was expected to cost. It is one of the reasons that explains the fact that while population has increased about 15 per cent in the past few years, public expenditures have increased four times over and public debt seven times over.—Myrtle Point Herald.

Public debt should not be permitted to pyramid, and any advice that tends to hold down public debt is commendable, but the Herald's analysis may not be entirely correct in its analysis.

Let's take an example at home: Cottage Grove recently retired a general fund bond issue on which the interest had been paid for a fifth time the principal, and none of the bonds had been retired. As the old bonds were retired with a new issue, the interest charge will continue until the total will approximate twice the principal.

On the face of it the city of Cottage Grove will have paid the original debt three times.

Where does the money come from with which city debts are paid? We who are property owners know.

If the bonds referred to had been retired in 20 years, as they should have been in accordance with good business practice, the money for their payment would have come from the taxpayers of the city.

The ordinary taxpayer frequently borrows money, or gets interest on money, directly or indirectly. Eight per cent is considered a reasonable rate of interest for ordinary loans. Eight per cent is not a big rate of interest for money to earn when invested in business or industry.

The bond issue referred to bore interest at 6 per cent.

Now, if this bond issue had been retired in 20 years, as it should have been, it would have been retired with money which many taxpayers either would have borrowed at 8 per cent or which earned 8 per cent for them. In other words, while it would have been good business to have arranged for the bonds to be paid during the 20 years, yet it is a fact that if the same taxpayers would have provided the money for their payment then as will provide the money for their payment now, such taxpayers are actually money ahead, instead of having paid the principal three times.

Here's another way of looking at it: Money that is invested is costing just as much as money owed. If you have cash with which to buy a home, you save paying interest on the money you have invested, but the money you just as much as the money the other fellow borrows with which to buy his home, for if you hadn't put it in the home it probably would be earning you as much or more than the other fellow pays in interest.

As a matter of fact it is usually pretty good business to owe money at 6 per cent provided you put the money to work.

All of this is by way of saying that the mere fact that a municipality or a person pays in interest two or three times the principal does not prove that there has been a loss to the taxpayer by that proceeding, even though the proceeding is not a good one, measured by business standards.
