THE SOY BEAN A Great General Purpose Crop.

The soy bean is one of the world's oldest crops, having been grown in the Orient for many centuries. While it is one of the youngest crops in America, it has swept the country in the last few years and is now becoming one of our great staple crops.

There are enough tested varieties to fit almost any climate, soil or purpose. There is perhaps no other crop that has so many valuable uses as the soy bean.

When grown as a cash crop, the return per acre is nearly always equal to and often in excess of that for wheat and it removes considerable quantities of nitrogen from the soil.

There seems to be practically no end to the commercial possibilities when sufficient demand is stimulated. One prominent authority and enthusiast has classified possible uses of soy beans under the three general headings of soy bean meal, oil and food products.

There is no better crop to plant with corn to hog down or to leave the beans in the field for the brood sows and fall pigs to clean up the and winter after the corn has been husked.

There is no special advantage in grinding beans for hogs—simply keep plenty of them and a mineral mixture in a self-feeder before the hogs. On account of the high oil content, beans will not grind well alone anyhow.

after the crop is removed and following with the wheat drill. It finds that the nitrogen which has been stored up in the soil by the soy bean roots stimulates the wheat and puts it in better shape to go into the winter than anything he has ever tried.

Beans for seed should always be thoroughly inoculated to insure plenty of the nitrogen gathering bacteria on the roots. This may be done with commercial cultures or by taking some soil from a field where a well inoculated crop has grown, mixing it with water in a sprinkling can until the water is well colored, dumping the beans on a clean barn floor a few bushels at a time, sprinkling them and mixing them well with a scoop shovel.

The method of planting and the variety to use will depend upon the soil, whether it is foul with weeds, or the purpose for which the crop is to be grown and the local climatic conditions. Time is not available to go into those matters. But farmers in your neighborhood, who are growing them, your county agricultural agent or your state agricultural college can settle all of those questions.
