Depressions and Advertising

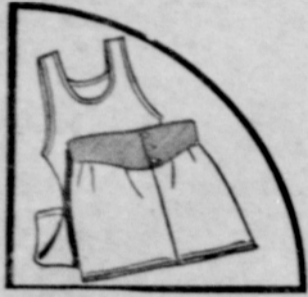
