LUMBERMEN OF STATE DEMAND WOOD BRIDGES

Highway Commission Told That Non-Lumber States Favor Oregon Product.

BALEM, July 30.—The state highway commission in meeting Thursday afternoon adopted a resolution that it would use lumber as far as possible in construction of bridges. The group voted to have its engineers meet with lumbermen officials of the state to work out plans for use of lumber. Fifty lumbermen from all parts of Oregon and some from California and Washington descended on the state highway commission to make demands that the highway commission use lumber in bridge construction instead of steel and concrete, the prevailing materials. The lumbermen staged an impressive demonstration and a large audience was on hand to hear their arguments, some 1000 persons attending the highway commission meetings in the interest of various highway projects. The Willamette Valley Lumbermen's association delegation, headed by J. S. Magladry, president of the group, drove to Salem in cars on which were banners reading "We Want Wooden Bridges." There were 15 in this group alone. The lumbermen presented a brief showing that lumber is highly in favor for bridges in non-lumber sections of the country.

County Gets School Money. A check for \$22,314.40, representing Lane county's share of interest from the irreducible school fund for the current year, has been received by Grace Schiska, county treasurer, from the state land board. The check is the equivalent of \$1.48 for each of the 15,080 children of school age listed in the county. The per capita is 10 cents less than last year per pupil due to the lowered earnings of the fund.
