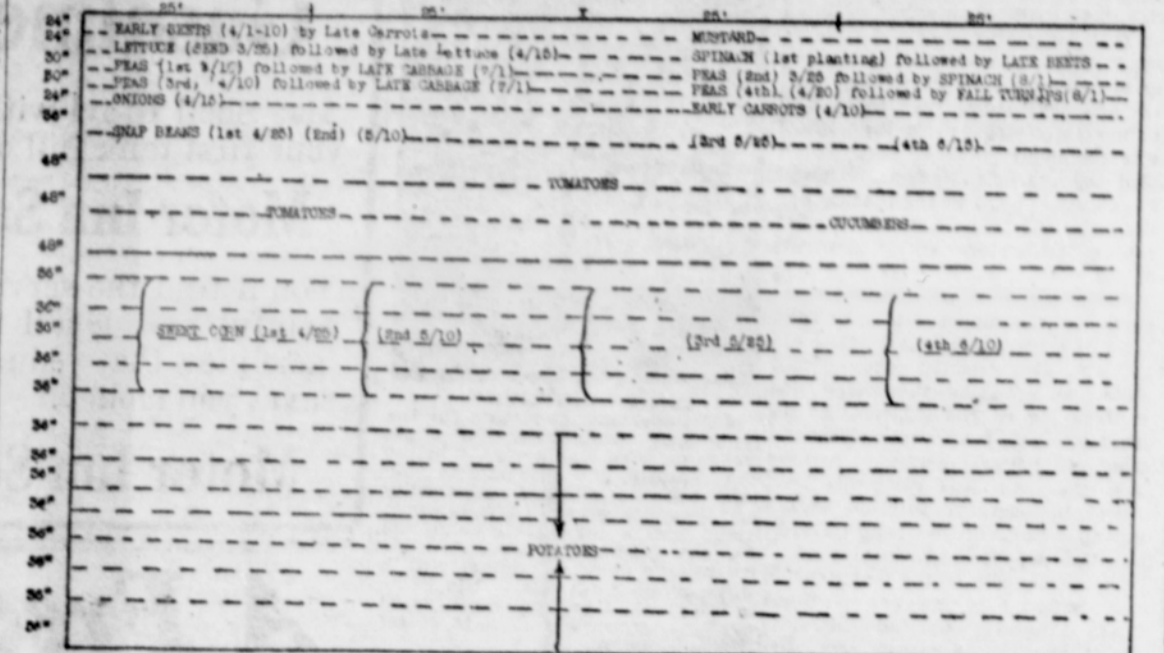

SUMMONS. In the circuit court of the state of Oregon for Lane county.

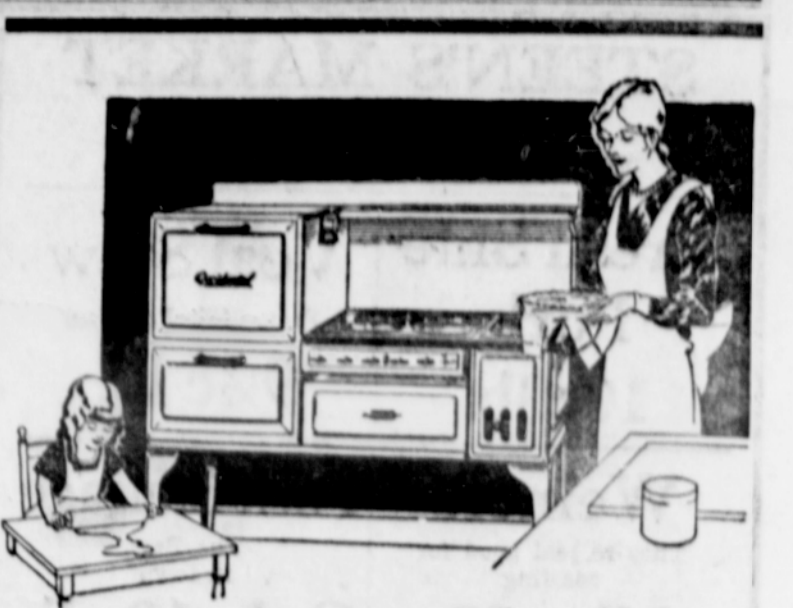
Mary Stearns, plaintiff, vs. Arthur Stearns, defendant. To: Arthur Stearns, the above named defendant.
