5 Cents Per Capita Is Seal Sale Goal

The annual Christmas seal sale is now in full progress here. The drive began Thanksgiving day. Mrs. Frank L. Chambers and Mrs. J. Bishop Tinkle, co-chairmen of the Lane County Health association and directors of the stamp sale in the county, have set their goal at five cents per capita, to be purchased by the 54,000 residents of the district.

The tuberculosis death rate in Oregon has decreased from 85 per 100,000 population in 1915 to 42 in 1931, a slash of 60 per cent in the ravages of the white plague. It is largely money derived from the sale of these seals which is financing the organized battle against the tubercle bacillus.
