## Old British Ceremony

Old American Canal  
Funds for the building of the Erie canal were appropriated by the state of New York on April 17, 1817. The necessary sum was raised by duties on goods sold at public auction, taxes on steamboat passengers, on salt manufactured within the state, real estate within 25 miles of the route and by various grants and donations. The canal was opened October 26, 1825.
