QUITS ADVERTISING—FAILS!

E. L. Murdock, proprietor of a former leading ladies' ready-to-wear store at Champaign, Ill., closed the doors of the store to avoid being thrown into bankruptcy. In a statement to the Champaign News-Gazette he set forth the principal reasons for the store's failure to maintain prestige and prosperity it had enjoyed in times past. He said:

"Perhaps the greatest contributing cause is the fact that four years ago our firm, because we thought the rate was too high, discontinued all advertising in the News-Gazette. We tried other forms of advertising to supplant the News-Gazette, but found none effective. Our business continued on the down grade. Seemingly our friends had forgotten us. The fault was ours." Pegging an editorial on the above unusual news, the Evergreen ((Ala.) Courant made this comment: "No amount of handbills, circulars, signboards or other devices can take the place of the newspaper that goes into the home and is read by every member of the family."
