

Football Game Is Homecoming Event

Oregon State-U. of O. Teams to Clash on Hayward Field, Eugene, Saturday.

A strictly offensive battle, with both teams bending every effort to roll up scores, looms for Saturday afternoon when the University of Oregon and Oregon State college meet on Hayward field in Eugene. The football game will be the major event of the annual Homecoming celebration to be staged this week end.

Oregon State's sophomore aggression has demonstrated its scoring power in every game this fall, while Oregon hasn't shown much offensive power so far. However, with two weeks of almost constant work on running and passing plays and with a more experienced forward wall, the Webfoots are expected to have a slight edge over their opponents.

Four lettermen and three sophomores will start in Coach Prink Callison's line Saturday. They are Stan Riordan and Bud Jones, ends; Del Bjork and Ken Skinner, tackles; Ross Carter and Tony Amate, guards; and Vern Moore, center. The backfield men will be John Reischman, quarter; Goodin and Bom Braddock, halfbacks, and Frank Michak, fullback.

The returning alumni will be greeted first with a big noise parade and rally Friday evening, the homecoming committee has announced. The entertainment scheduled for Saturday includes a cafeteria luncheon from 11:30 until 1:30 when the alumni may renew acquaintances with old classmates and mingle with the students. The game, which is the thirty-ninth annual meeting of the two teams, is to start at two o'clock.

Saturday evening there will be an all-campus dance to which the alumni are invited. Sunday the social sororities and fraternities will be hosts to returning members.
