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Telephone Tax Is \$8.53 Per Set

Total taxes of the Pacific Telephone and Telegraph company in Oregon on its operations in 1935 were \$986,787, or an average of \$8.53 per telephone for the year—more than 71 cents per telephone per month.

This was made known by R. B. Bacon, district manager for the company, with the payment to Lane county of \$43,302.27 for ad valorem taxes, with the discount for prompt payment.

The Oregon tax per telephone for 1935 is 85 cents. The \$7.68 average tax per telephone for the company as a whole.
