At Monticello, the beautiful, mountain-top mansion designed and lived in by Thomas Jefferson, are many examples of this statesman's inventive turn of mind. In Jefferson's own bedroom he had the bed so made that it could be raised on ropes and pulleys, and concealed in the ceiling when it was not in use. This gave him more space in the room for his work table and chairs. Perhaps it was the first roll-away or in-a-ceiling bed.
