It is a scientific application of the knowledge of the weaker spots in the human anatomy to offensive and defensive. Every trick that would be accounted "foul" in wrestling and boxing is the height of excellence in jujitsu. This science is taught to every officer and enlisted man of the Japanese army, navy and police force.

The Word Babel
