Eugene Requested to Continue Joint Support of Juvenile Officer.

Judge Fred Fisk has requested the city of Eugene to defer its proposal for the abandonment of the joint support of the county juvenile officer until the beginning of next year. Under the present set-up the city schools pay \$500 each year toward Juvenile Officer Perry Price's salary. The city schools believe that it would be to their best interests to hire their own officer, for the work they hope to do will be preventive rather than "police work." Judge Fisk made his request in view of the fact that the 1937 budget has already been made up and this change would upset the allowances made for this office. If the city waits until 1938, the change can be provided for in the new budget.

Tax Turnovers.

Tax turnovers on the 1937 current roll during the past two weeks totalled \$11,609.10, and collections on the delinquent rolls from 1927 to 1936 totalled \$11,071.41.

J. E. Young, justice of the peace at Cottage Grove turned over \$10 in fines Tuesday morning.

Campground inspection fees totalling \$135 were received by the county treasurer last week. Each campground must pay \$7.50 for the inspection which is required by the state board of health.

L. C. Moffitt, county school superintendent is in Salem attending a two day conference of county school superintendents from all over the state. He will be back in his office Friday.

Road Work Progressing.

Good progress is being made on the Bennett creek road northwest of Cottage Grove. This is a new road and is being built over the site of an old trail. A WPA crew and the county bulldozers are working there now according to P. M. Morse, county surveyor.

The county's "60" outfit is working on the Sears road between Creswell and Delight Valley. Mr. Morse expects that the crew will finish grading a mile of the road this year but will not complete it. Two or three more weeks will be required to complete repairs on the county's oil roads.

Plans for the extension of work on Route F for the coming year have been submitted to the county court for approval, Morse reports. Commissioner Walter Holland went to the Deadwood district Tuesday to inspect a bridge there which is to be repaired.

Lane Equalization Board to Meet.

The Lane county board of equalization will meet August 9 at the county courthouse in Eugene and will continue in session for 14 days. The board will publicly examine the assessment roll and correct all errors in valuation, description or qualities of lands, lots or other property assessed by the assessor.
