

Local Florist Builds Modern Greenhouse

Many Improvements Made by W. L. Workman; 15,000 Chrysanthemums Being Grown.

Construction of a modern greenhouse, 36 by 100 feet, has been completed by the Sunnyside Greenhouses and the structure will be glassed soon. The new house replaces the 20-year-old houses along Q street which have been torn down. Glass from the old houses was salvaged and will be used in roofing the new building.

W. L. Workman, owner of the Sunnyside Greenhouses, also has added an auxiliary boiler to supplement the new heating plant installed last year. This new equipment will take care of any emergency that might arise from excessive cold weather.

The space occupied by the old greenhouses will be used for ornamental shrubs and trees as Mr. Workman is adding this line to his business. Mr. Workman also is importing bulbs from Holland and expects to receive soon a shipment of hyacinth and tulip bulbs.

The new greenhouse already is planted to 15,000 chrysanthemum plants which will be ready for the fall season. The 15,000-planting includes 20 new varieties of chrysanthemums as well as the standard blooms. Among the new varieties is the Detroit News, a showy bronze bloom; Silver Sheen, a white variety, and Golden Age, a large yellow blossom.

Two weeks ago four greenhouses were planted to tomatoes for the winter market. The Sunnyside Greenhouses ship this product to markets throughout the northwest.

In addition there is one house planted to sweet peas and one and a half houses to carnations. Seven hundred cyclamen plants are being brought along for the Christmas season.

The Sunnyside Greenhouses handle both wholesale and retail trade. They sell wholesale a big percentage of their flowers to dealers in Eugene and Roseburg and some to Portland.

Mr. Workman is president of the Southern Oregon Florists association and will fly back to Philadelphia the middle of September to attend the national convention.

Prices Advance At Arcade Sept. 1
