Radio Go Haywire?

"Heavieside" Blamed

Stanford University, Calif.—The heaviest, a blanket of electrically charged atmosphere 50 to 100 miles above the earth, is responsible for some of the interference in radio reception. Professor Norris E. Bradbury told the American Physical society.

Many of the radio waves which reach receiving sets, he said, travel upward from the broadcasting station to the heavieside and back again to earth. The atmosphere of the heavieside is so rare that no balloon could float in it. It is far above the stratosphere.

Sheep Tails a Delicacy

The tail is esteemed a great delicacy, and to protect it from being injured by dragging on the ground, it is sometimes supported by a board or small pair of wheels. Naming Johns Hopkins University
Johns Hopkins university is named for Johns Hopkins, a financier and philanthropist, born in 1795, died 1873. He became a grocer in Baltimore at seventeen, and in 1822 founded the house of Hopkins & Bros., building up an almost monopolistic trade in Maryland, Virginia and North Carolina. He used his large fortune in railway and banking operations, and gave over \$3,000,000 to found the Johns Hopkins university.

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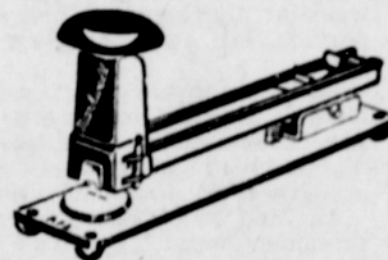
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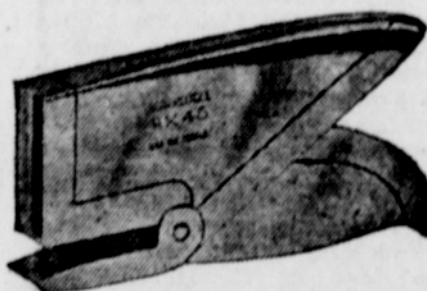
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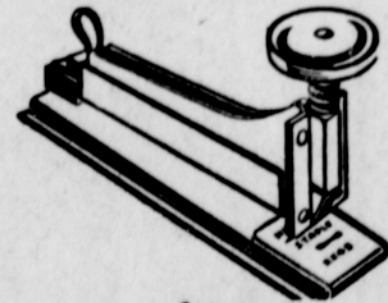
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
