SOLON T. HITE TO HEAD SOIL CONSERVATION

Solon T. Hite, one time vocational agriculture instructor in the Cottage Grove high school, will become state coordinator in Oregon for the soil conservation service, with headquarters at Corvallis, effective August 1.

A native of Oregon and a graduate of Oregon State college, Mr. Hite spent two years as vocational agriculture instructor in the Cottage Grove high school and eight years as county agricultural

agent before his appointment as head of the state department of agriculture three years ago.

In his new capacity, Mr. Hite will be responsible for the development of plans and programs for soil conservation in the state, coordination of field activities and the maintenance of cooperative relationships with state agencies.
