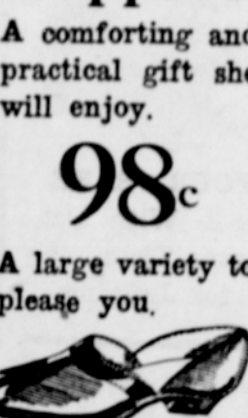

leaving him unconscious.

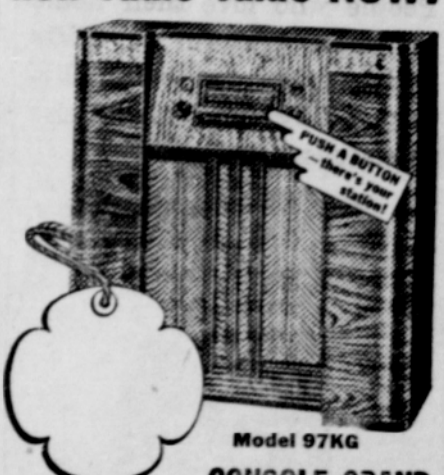
