screen of the lake, closed to angling.

Gold lake, open season for angling June 1 to June 30, both dates inclusive.

Hazel, Betty, Billy's, Jim, Swan, Weston and Notch lakes, closed to angling.

Mirror, Logan, Nash, Charlton, Mink, Mud, Cliff, Island, Dumbell, Lake Denude, Marilyn, Upper Horse, Middle Horse, Lower Horse, Hidden and the Three Ermabelle lakes, open season for angling April 15 to September 20, both dates inclusive.

Ten Mile and Big Creeks, open season for angling November 1, 1939, to February 28, 1940, both dates inclusive; provided that there shall be no closed season for taking of trout over ten inches in length in that part of Ten Mile creek from its mouth up to the old highway bridge.

All tributaries of Lake Creek from its source to Triangle lake, closed to angling.

Lake creek, tributary to Triangle lake, open season for angling April 15 to August 31, both dates inclusive; provided that that part of Lake creek from the Horton Road bridge at Blachly up to its source, closed to angling.

Condon creek and all its tributaries, closed to angling.

Maple creek, a tributary to Siltcoos lake, open season for angling April 15 to October 15, both dates inclusive; provided further that there shall be no open season for any angling for trout of any size from October 16, 1939, to April 14, 1940, both dates inclusive, above a point approximately one mile east of Siltcoos station.

Fiddle creek, a tributary to Siltcoos lake, open season for angling April 15 to October 15, both dates inclusive; provided further that there shall be no open season for any angling for trout of any size from October 16, 1939, to April 14, 1940, both dates inclusive, above a point where the highway bridge crosses said creek on the old Gardiner road.

That part of Siltcoos river, outlet to Siltcoos lake, from a point 50 feet west of the first CCC bridge west of the highway downstream to the ocean, closed to angling.

All tributaries of Siltcoos lake, except as otherwise herein provided, closed to angling.

Sutton creek, outlet to Sutton lake, from where the coast highway bridge crosses said creek downstream to the ocean, closed to angling.

All tributaries to Mercer and Sutton lakes and the stream connecting said lakes, closed to angling.

That part of the Middle Fork of the Willamette river beginning at the head fish rack site adjacent to the city of Oakridge and extending downstream 2,640 feet, closed to angling.

All tributaries of the Willamette river above Lowell bridge, except the North Fork, Salt, Salmon, Hills, Staley and Swift creeks, closed to angling.

Winberry creek, tributary to Big Fall creek, from junction of the north and south forks to the sources of said forks, closed to angling.

All tributaries to Little Fall creek, closed to angling.

All tributaries to Lost creek, closed to angling.

Big Fall creek from mouth of HeeHee creek to its source, closed to angling.

All tributaries to Big Fall creek above the mouth of Winberry creek, closed to angling.

Little Fall creek from point known as Big or Upper dam to its source, closed to angling.

Bryce creek and all tributaries thereto above its confluence with Champion creek, closed to angling.

Layng creek and all tributaries thereto above its confluence with Dinner creek, closed to angling.

Martin creek and all tributaries thereto above its confluence with Sharps creek, closed to angling.

Mosby creek and all tributaries thereto above its confluence with Palmer Ford, closed to angling.

Salt creek from Gold lake to Salt creek falls, a distance of approximately three miles, closed to angling.

Nelson creek, Greenleaf creek and Fish creek, all tributaries of Lake creek, closed to angling.

Indian creek, tributary to Lake creek, and West Fork of Indian creek, from the forks of said creeks to their sources, closed to angling.

Bear creek, Misery creek and Fallor creek, including all tributaries of said creeks, closed to angling.

Deadwood creek and all its tributaries above the Alpha post office, closed to angling.

North Fork of the Siuslaw river from the forks above Pawn, closed to angling.

All tributaries of the North Fork of the Siuslaw river, closed to angling.

Knowles creek and all its tributaries, closed to angling.

All tributaries of the Siuslaw river above the mouth of Lake creek, except Wolf and Wildcat creeks, closed to angling.

That part of Sweet creek above the first bridge above the Sweet creek falls and all tributaries thereto, closed to angling.

That part of the McKenzie river beginning at the head rack site on the properties of the Fish Commission and Highway Commission and extending downstream 1,200 feet to the Hendricks bridge across said river, closed to angling.

All tributaries of the McKenzie river below the junction of Blue river, except Mohawk creek, closed to angling.

All tributaries of the South Fork of the McKenzie river, closed to angling.

Mill creek, tributary of Mohawk creek, closed to angling.

North Fork of Mohawk creek, closed to angling.

Except as otherwise herein specifically provided for, open season for angling April 15 to October 15, both dates inclusive.

DOUGLAS COUNTY

That part of the North Umpqua river from a point 300 feet above the upper fish racks of the Fish Commission of Oregon to a point 200 feet below the lower fish racks, closed to angling.

That part of Fish lake lying east of a line beginning at a point 400 feet north of the mouth of High Rock creek and extending to a point 400 feet west of the mouth of High Rock creek, closed to angling.

That part of Tahkenitch creek, outlet to Lake Tahkenitch, from a point one mile below the coast highway bridge downstream to the ocean, closed to angling.

Steamboat creek and its tributaries, closed to angling.

Silent creek, a tributary to Diamond lake and that part of Diamond lake lying within a radius of 450 feet from the mouth of Silent creek, closed to angling.

Lake creek from a point where said creek empties out of Diamond lake to the point downstream where the lower or second bridge crosses said stream, closed to angling.

Diamond lake, open season for angling May 20 to October 15, both dates inclusive; provided that that part of Diamond lake lying northwesterly of a line beginning at a point on the north shore of said lake 800 feet northwest of the mouth of Bear creek, running thence diagonally across said lake to a marker on the west shore of said lake, being 7,450 feet north of the mouth of Silent creek, closed to angling.

Short creek, a tributary to Diamond lake, closed to angling.

That part of Rock creek, a tributary of the North Umpqua river, from the Rock Creek dam downstream to its mouth, closed to angling.

All tributaries of Rock creek, closed to angling.

All tributaries of Smith river above the North Fork, closed to angling.

Little Mill creek, closed to angling.

Calamut and Wolf lakes, closed to angling.

Except as otherwise herein specifically provided for, open season for angling April 15 to October 15, both dates inclusive.
