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## Number Present at Dedication Service

A number of local people attended the dedication services for the new post office building at Eugene Monday evening. Judge G. F. Skipworth acted as master of ceremonies and introduced the Hon. Ambrose O'Connell, second assistant postmaster general, who made the principal address, urging liberal use of the cheap rates offered by the post office department. S. H. Morse, post office inspector for this district, presented the old post office building to the Lane county pioneers association. Response to the presentation was made by Cal Young, county commissioner, who told something of the history of the early mail service in Lane county and exhibited old photos of the mail service in the early 60's. Mr. Young also exhibited some of the records of the early mail service including the first mail box used by the early settlers, in the old office long abandoned.

The I. O. O. F. band rendered several musical numbers as part of the entertainment. Thirty-four postmasters over the state attended the dedication ceremonies as special guests of the occasion.
