The health of the family depends largely upon the homemaker herself, and with an eye to saving her family from sickness during the winter months, she should see that summer's fitness is retained. Here is a recipe for a dish which will help you to keep your vacation fitness:

Squash Au Gratin

3 lbs. Hubbard squash
1/2 lb. sharp cheese
2 tbsp butter
2 tbsp flour
1 tsp salt
1 cup milk
1/2 cup buttered bread crumbs.
Cut squash into large cubes and boil in salted water until tender. Put alternate layers of squash and cheese into a buttered casserole. Melt butter in saucepan, blend in flour and salt; add milk, stirring constantly. Cook until sauce thickens. Pour over squash and sprinkle with buttered

crumbs. Bake in slow oven, 300 degrees, for forty-five minutes. Serves six to eight.

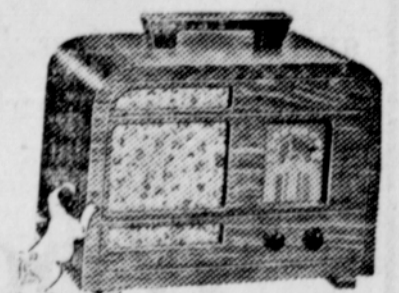
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
