

Lumber Loadings Showing Strength

Lumber shipments have been showing increasing strength from this district the past few weeks. The past week a total of 130 cars were shipped out from this district over the Southern Pacific for the second largest week's movement of the year. The previous week a total of 113 cars were loaded out.

A steady demand has given some strength to the market and slight price advances have been made in the past few weeks. Quotations on some grades of lumber have been withdrawn.

The European war has probably influenced the market to some extent, although, how the market may be eventually affected by the war is problematical. The greatest single factor in the present demand is said to be due to the fact that retail yards are trying to build up low inventories.

HONEY EATING BEAR CAUGHT

A bear's appetite for honey finally brought his downfall on High Prairie. Ercel Anlauf and Harlow Hubbell, who keep 200 hives of bees in the Westfir district, had been attempting to trap the bear for three weeks, after continued raids on their hives. He was trapped Friday.

The bear had raided several hives, taking about 50 pounds of honey and destroying the hives. Even the bees were gone. Attempts to lure him with a trap with an old hive had failed, as the bear walked circles around the trap only to attack another hive.

Sunday Anlauf and Hubbell went to Westfir to move their hives into the valley for the winter, and the bear was in the trap, where they shot him. He was about a year and a half old and weighed almost 200 pounds.

HIGH SCHOOL PRESS ASSOCIATION

Twenty-five persons were granted citizenship papers in circuit court at Eugene yesterday, at a session presided over by Judge G. F. Skipworth.

Field Work at Dams Has Slowed Up Now

Engineer department field work on both local damsites continues at a reduced pace this week. Investigation work at the Cottage Grove site continuing with one core drill. The District Office of the Department in Portland is busily engaged on design and planning problems. Drilling operations were resumed on the Dorena damsite with the transfer of one churn drill to that area from Fern Ridge. Consulting engineers are expected in the near future to make field inspections of the local sites and add their opinion to that of regular department engineers.

PURCHASE EGG TAKING STATION

The state game commission has purchased 1100 acres in the vicinity of Eel Lake situated partly in Douglas and partly in Coos counties for the purpose of using the lake as an egg taking station for cut-throat trout. The purchase includes approximately 1-3 of the shore line of the lake, including the outlet, and deals are pending whereby the commission hopes to purchase the entire shoreline. It is planned to use the lake to supply sufficient cut-throat trout to restock the coastal streams. Should the brooding grounds and egg taking stations provide sufficient eggs it is planned to use the hatchery site on South Coos river as a trout hatchery. The lake is to be stocked at once and will be closed to fishing. Willows will be planted along the edge of the lake and fresh water shrimp planted as food for the trout.

STATE COMMANDER VISITS

Neil R. Allen of Grants Pass, state commander of the American Legion, accompanied by his brother, Pete Allen, also of Grants Pass, visited briefly here yesterday morning en route home from Eugene, where Mr. Allen, installed the new officers of the Eugene post. Mr. Allen, who had just returned from the national convention at Chicago, said the position of the American Legion on the neutrality issue was very definite. The Legion, he said, proposes to stay out of the European conflict, come what may, unless this nation is invaded. While resolution to this effect was passed by the national body, the organization took no issue in the fight to revise the present neutrality law.

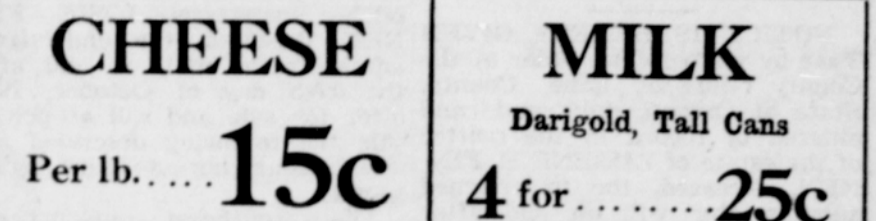
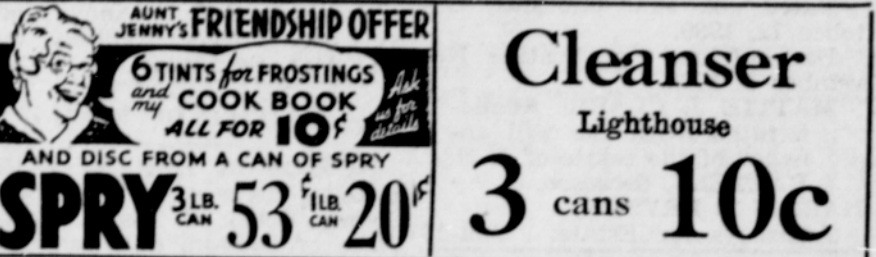
