

Open House for New Smith Chapel Saturday and Sunday

Open house for the new Smith Chapel at 115 North Sixth street will be held Saturday and Sunday, January 26 and 27 and the new institution will be formally dedicated Sunday. Open house scheduled for last week end was delayed because the repairs and alterations had not been completed, but the chapel will be ready for public inspection Saturday, Russell E. Smith, proprietor, said yesterday.

The property at 115 North Sixth street was purchased by Mr. and Mrs. Smith last November from E. R. Lemley. Repair work was immediately started on the building, formerly known as the Knox residence. Both stories of the building has been redecorated and renovated and a chapel added to the south part of the lower story. The chapel, 20 by 44 feet, will accommodate 120 people and through special arrangement the adjoining rooms can be thrown open to accommodate 200.

The lower story has been decorated with cream and tan and many windows, both in the chapel addition and adjoining rooms, provides ample light. Semi-indirect lighting system has been installed on the lower floor. High ceilings throughout the lower story supply the necessary setting for the patrons at all times.

Features of the chapel include an alcove built at the end of the chapel for the casket. Masonite flooring has been laid on the chapel floor, giving the chapel distinctive charm with the elimination of unnecessary noises. The family room is equipped with a fireplace and a private entrance.

The exterior of the property will be finished in white, the painting to be completed as soon as the weather permits. Mr. and Mrs. Smith will occupy the upper story of the funeral home as a residence.

Mr. and Mrs. Smith moved down from Eugene about two weeks ago. Mr. Smith was associated with the Veatch funeral home in Eugene for several years.

Westfir Man Was Accidentally Shot

Ernest Brown, 27, of Westfir, was accidentally shot and seriously wounded by Roy Bairrett on the Alpine trail on Buckhead mountain five miles above Westfir about noon Friday. The injured man was taken to a Eugene hospital where attending doctors said Saturday that it is believed the wound will not be fatal.

Both men, residents of Westfir, started for the mountain Friday forenoon, Bairrett carrying a .22 calibre rifle. At the time of the accident the two men were walking through the brush off the trail with Bairrett in the rear. He told police that the trigger of the rifle was caught in the brush and the gun discharged. The bullet entered his companion's right hip.

Bairrett, after making his companion as comfortable as possible ran back to Westfir for help. A party of 16 men was made up and the victim of the shooting was carried home on an improvised stretcher. He was brought to the hospital in Eugene Saturday evening.
