Ships' Graveyard Discovered

While marooned on Robben island for two days, 60 schoolboys of Cape-town, South Africa, discovered a ships' graveyard that had not been known to exist. The wreckage, composed of companionways, hawsers, rope rails, bunks, sea boots, peak caps and other articles, lay strewn along the beach for nearly three miles. This wreckage is believed to have come from ships that had been wrecked on the island or scuttled in Table bay.

How U. S. Printing Started

Stephen Daye (about 1594-1668) came to Massachusetts in 1638 under contract to the Rev. Samuel Glover, who brought along a printing press, but himself died on the voyage. Daye set up the press in Cambridge and there in 1639 issued as a broadside "The Freeman's Oath," the first piece of printing in the Colonies.
