

### "Share the Road" Club Again Featured by Shell Oil Company

Following up the success scored last year Shell Oil Company, Incorporated, is again featuring this season the popular "Share-the-Road" club, which was created to launch a crusade against the discourteous motorists on our streets and highways, according to Roy F. Sunderland, local manager for the company here.

The club will focus its attention this year on another menace—the "Screwjays." He is the pedestrian who against traffic signals crosses the street in the middle of the block and disrupts the steady flow of cars, increasing stop-and-go driving. The "Screwjays" is stepbrother to the "Screwdriver," and leading traffic experts agree that together they are responsible for more than one-third of all stop-and-go delays in traffic.

New and improved emblems are being featured this year, and will be given to motorists who wish to display their colors as being in sympathy with this national movement on the part of Shell to increase interest in better traffic manners. These emblems do double duty in that they glow at night and still maintain the same design as last year—marine signal flags in color against a gold background. Tiny crystal beads cover the emblem and reflect the light when headlights are focused on them.

Local police and traffic authorities have hailed this program as being in line with their efforts to promote better manners on the busy streets, materially reducing the annoyance caused by unnecessary stop-and-go driving.

#### ON NATURALIZATION OF VETERANS

A comparatively recent act of congress has extended to aliens who served in the World War, the opportunity of becoming citizens of the United States, without the usual period of waiting. The applicant must be able to show an honorable discharge for the military service of the United States and provide witnesses who have known him for five years or who will testify to his moral character. There are no fees.

Petitions must be filed before May 25, 1940. Information on the subject may be had by writing to Naturalization Service, Room 217, U. S. Court House, Portland, Oregon, and from local service officers of veterans organizations or local chapters of the American Red Cross, according to Chet Vandenburg, Commander, Calvin Funk Post, American Legion.

### Timely Recipes

**Jellied Pineapple Gems**  
1 package lemon-flavored gelatin  
1 1/2 cups hot water

1/2 cup syrup, drained from gems  
4 tablespoons lemon juice  
Few grains salt  
1-14 oz. can pineapple, drained  
1 cup finely diced celery  
3 tablespoons chopped pimento  
Lettuce

Fruit salad dressing  
Dissolve gelatin in hot water. Add pineapple sirup, lemon juice, salt. Chill until it begins to thicken. Mix in the pineapple, celery and pimento. Pour into six oiled individual molds and chill until firm. Unmold on lettuce leaves; Serve with fruit salad dressing. Serves six.

**Lamb Chops With Orange**  
6 lamb, veal or pork chops  
Melted butter  
Sliced oranges  
Salt, pepper and paprika.

Trim fat from thick chops and dip in melted butter. Oil broiler well and broil chops 8 minutes. Turn and place a thick slice of peeled orange on each chop. Broil 8 or 10 minutes longer. Sprinkle generously with the seasonings. Serve hot.

**Limas in Cream**  
2 cups cooked, dried limas  
1 cup cream or rich milk  
1 tablespoon butter  
1/2 teaspoon salt  
1/2 teaspoon pepper

Place all ingredients in double boiler and cook over hot water until thoroughly heated.

**Lima and Walnut Salad**  
For each service allow 1/2 cup cooked limas and 1 tablespoon broken walnut meats. Serve with French dressing.

**Orange Ice-Box Cake**  
(Serves 8-10)  
1/4 cup orange juice  
1 tablespoon gelatine  
Soak 5 minutes and liquefy over hot water. Add:  
One-third cup sugar, dissolved in 1/2 cup boiling water  
1/2 cup orange juice  
Cool. Mix:  
12 marshmallows, cut into eighths  
1/2 cup orange pieces

Let stand while gelatine mixture cools. When gelatine begins to stiffen, beat until fluffy. Fold in orange pieces and marshmallows, and lastly:  
1 cup whipping cream, beaten stiff

Line bottom of spring form with halves of ladyfingers. Cut one round end from enough halves of ladyfingers to stand up around edge of form. The cut ends touch the bottom of the pan. Allow:  
24 ladyfingers  
Pour in half the filling. Lay on any pieces or extra ladyfingers and cover with rest of filling. Leave in ice-box over night or until thoroughly chilled. Remove sides of spring form when ready to serve. Decorate with additional whipped cream and orange segments.

**Swedish Crisp Cookies**  
1 cup butter or substitute  
2 cups sugar  
3 eggs  
2 tablespoons cream or top milk  
3 cups flour  
2 teaspoons baking powder  
1 teaspoon cinnamon  
1 teaspoon mace or nutmeg  
Cream butter or substitute; add sugar, and cream again. Add unbeaten eggs and beat all. Add cream or milk and fold in sifted dry ingredients. Roll out to about one-third inch thick, cut with cookie cutter and bake in a hot oven (400 deg. F.) for 15 minutes.

**Baked Ham, Potatoes and Onions**  
Place in a roasting pan: A 2-lb. slice of smoked ham,  
Peel and slice: 6 medium-sized potatoes,  
Spread them over the ham.  
Sift over the potatoes: 1/2 cup bread flour; A little paprika,  
Peel, slice and add: 2 large onions,  
Cover these ingredients with milk.  
Cover the dish. Bake the ham in a moderate oven 350 deg. F. for about 1 hour.

**Pointer Out-of-Bounds**  
Last year at the national bird dog championships down South, a noted champion pointer, highly regarded as the ultimate winner of the title stake, got beyond control of its handler. The dog quit seeking birds and devoted considerable time to chasing pigs around a field on a nearby farm.
