Notice of School Election to Approve Budget

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN To the legal voters of Union High School District No. 14, Lane County, Oregon, that an election will be held in the Music Room, Union High School Building, Cottage Grove, Lane County, State of Oregon, in said Union High School District No. 14, Lane County, Oregon, on the 24th day of June, 1940, between the hours of 2:00 o'clock P. M. and 7:00 o'clock P.
