NYA Out of School Program to Start

PORTLAND — Effective this week, young men and women who seek placement on the NYA out-of-school work-experience program may apply for interviews at offices of Oregon state employment service as well as in NYA offices established in various communities.

Ivan G. Munro, state NYA administrator, announced that assistance by the employment service has been arranged in order to accommodate an "increasing volume" of youths who wish to obtain NYA training and work-experience.

In communities where neither NYA nor the employment service maintains offices, the NYA will designate a person to interview young people and to receive their applications, it was stated.

Munro said that under NYA eligibility rules for the new fiscal year, which opened July 1, applications will be accepted from all youths between the ages of 18 and 24, inclusive, who are "in need of employment, work-experience and training."

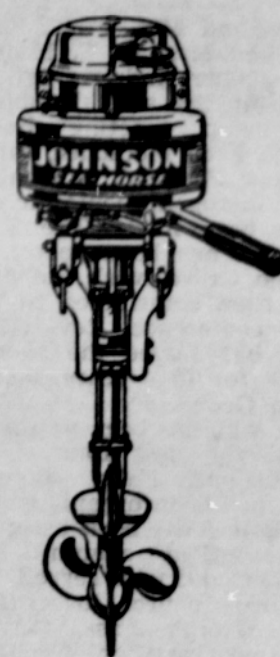
