Traffic Accidents Are Up for June

Oregon traffic accidents resulted in 35 fatalities during June this year as against 25 in June, 1939. Secretary of State Snell reported yesterday. Persons injured increased from 587 in June, 1939, to 624 in June this year.

Deaths from traffic accidents for the six months ending June 30 this year totaled 161 as compared to 141 during the same period in 1939. Accidents increased from 16,229 to 16,749 while persons injured decreased from 3151 to 3045. Ten persons killed in June were pedestrians.

500 DEFENSE GOAL FOR AUGUST

PORTLAND, August 7 — Young men of Oregon are volunteering for regular army service in even greater numbers than was anticipated when the preparedness recruiting drive started May 21. Lieutenant Colonel H. D. Bagnall, recruiting officer for the state, announced. "Instead of the 300 men the Oregon district was expected to enlist during July, we found that our final count for the month was 417," he said.

Because of this willingness of young Oregonians to enlist for defense, the district has set the enlistment of 500 volunteers as its goal for August. Men applying for enlistment during August will have the widest choice of assignments ever offered to Pacific coast residents. Infantry, air corps, harbor defense artillery, anti-aircraft artillery, quarter-master corps, medical department, signal corps, ordnance department, field artillery and finance department are all open to recruits. Recruits can choose any army post in the eight western states, Alaska or the Philippine Islands for service.

CIVIL SERVICE EXAMINATION FOR FISH COUNTER

Death on Dry Roads Seventy-seven per cent of the fatal automobile accidents last year occurred on dry roads.

LOW USE OF OIL

When an automobile engine uses an abnormally low amount of oil the fact should be regarded with suspicion rather than pride, suggests the Emergency Road Service of the Oregon Motor Association. Excessive dilution of oil in the crankcase by fuel leaking past the pistons may be taking place.

Motorists have been known to return from long trips with more "oil" than when they started out, although they have not added to the supply. The mystery was explained by the discovery that dilution by gasoline had actually raised the crankcase level.

Naturally, oil thus diluted suffers great loss of lubricating efficiency and threatens serious damage to the motor.

Among the causes of excessive dilution are worn pistons and rings, using a poor grade of gasoline, and running with choke out.

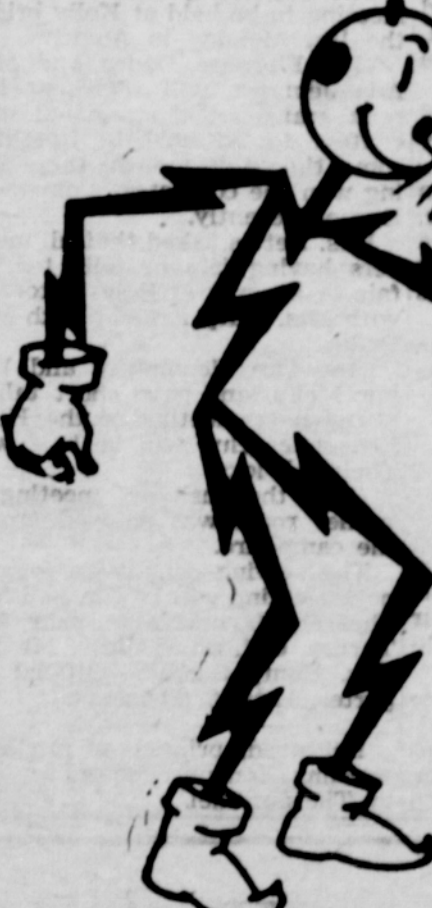
