COLUMBIA NOW MINT OIL CENTER

ST. HELENS.—Columbia county is now one of the largest mint oil producing areas in the United States with over 1000 acres planted to peppermint, reports G. A. Nelson, county agricultural agent. This area produces a crop of peppermint oil worth about \$100,000 annually. The growers recently took preliminary steps to form a cooperative organization to market the crop. The chief producing areas are in the Rainier and Clatskanie districts.

Rural Husbands

According to a survey made by the American Association of University Women, 57 per cent of rural husbands are willing to assume "some domestic responsibility to free their wives for outside interests," while only 40 per cent of city husbands are willing to do so.

Big Three

Exploration Work At Mines Continue

Exploration work at the H. & H. Mines in the Bohemia district is still going forward and so far as known will continue through the winter months in the Champion mine. The mining crew are still running drifts in the No. 9 tunnel of the Champion, which will be run through the hill to supply an outlet for two other mines, the Musick and Noonday, it is understood. So far as known now the addition of a mill planned earlier in the season will not likely be added before spring or summer.

A large parking space has been leveled near the Champion boarding house and a new road has been built to the No. 12 tunnel.

Frank Watkins, former operator of the Noonday and Champion has moved equipment he formerly used in these mines to California.

Assessment work has been completed for the year on a group of claims in the Bohemia district.

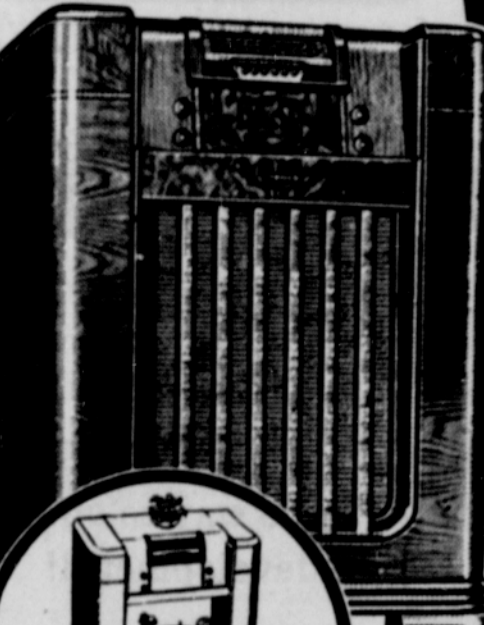

CREAM OF CELERY SOUP

- 1 bunch of celery
