

Allen O'Hern Rites Are Held Saturday

Rites for Allen John O'Hern, 39, were held Saturday morning at the Catholic church with Father Anthony Gerace officiating. Rosary was held at the Smith chapel Friday evening at 7:30 and interment was made in the L. O. O. F. Masonic cemetery. He died in a Eugene hospital October 30th.

Mr. O'Hern came to Cottage Grove in 1938 from South Dakota and had followed the roofing trade since coming here. He was born at Spirit Lake, Iowa, October 5, 1901, where he spent his early life, moving to South Dakota twenty years ago.

Surviving are his father and mother, Mr. and Mrs. Michael O'Hern of Cottage Grove, and four brothers, Francis, Russell and Daniel O'Hern of South Dakota, and Leonard O'Hern of Cottage Grove.

THE HUMAN BODY
