

Livestock Market

The livestock market at the Portland Union Stock Yards in North Portland, for the week ended November 9th, showed a day to day advance in hog prices. From the Monday opening on carlots at \$6.40, the price advanced until at the week end truckings weighing 170 to 215 pounds were bringing \$6.75. Cattle prices remained steady throughout the week, with an early advance of 25c in fed steers. The outlet was dependable in the sheep alleys, with a good percentage of the woolled truck-in lambs bringing \$8.50. There were 2,150 cattle, 225 calves, 3,800 hogs and 1,900 sheep sold on the open market during the past week.

This week's market opened Monday with 2,325 cattle, 120 calves, 1,950 hogs and 1,200 sheep for sale on the open market.

The cattle market was generally on a steady price basis, but the trade was somewhat slower Monday. There were a good many sales of grassy and short fed steers at \$8.65 to \$9.00, with a few loads of longer fed offerings at \$9.25 to \$9.75. Common to medium heifers sold around \$6.00 to \$8.25, with a few fed heifers at \$8.50 to \$8.75. Plain dairy cows met with a good outlet at strong prices. Medium to good bulls sold at \$6.50 to \$7.00, with a few upward to \$7.25. Good to choice vealers sold readily at \$10.00 to \$10.50.

Tuesday's trading was active on the comparatively large truck-in receipts. Cattle prices were steady with improvement in bull sales.

Carlot hogs sold at an advance of 25c on the opening market, compared to the previous Monday, moving at \$6.65 for tops. The market was active and 170 to 215 lb. truckins bulked at \$6.50 to \$6.60, with a few up to \$6.65 late. Butchers from 230 to 270 lbs. bulked at \$5.90 to \$6.00, with some in the rail division up to \$6.15. Packing sows ranged generally from \$4.50 to \$5.00.

Tuesday's hog market showed a further advance compared to Monday's strong close. The bulk of the good 170 to 215 lb. truckins brought \$6.65 to \$6.75, with two lots at \$6.85. Heavy butchers, packing sows and feeder pigs also showed 10 to 25c advances.

The sheep market was active and strong Monday. Good to choice trucked in woolled lambs bulked at \$8.35 to \$8.50, with one outstanding lot to \$8.90. A carlot of 98 lb. good to choice lambs cashed at \$8.75. Good slaughter ewes were steady, selling up to \$4.00.

Tuesday's sheep market continued active, with the bulk of the good woolled truck-in lambs selling \$8.40 to \$8.50, and quotable to \$8.75.

DRAWING FOR LOW NUMBERS

Oregon motorists were notified of the drawing for low 1941 automobile license numbers in letters which were sent out from the secretary of state's office November 6, it was announced yesterday. The drawing has been scheduled for Friday, November 22, at Salem.

All applications for 1941 license plates that are on file at the time the drawing is held will be included in the lottery for the low numbers. To date, 1,368 applications have been received by the state department. Last year, 1,400 applications were received the day after the letter was sent out to be followed by 2,350 the next day. By the day of the drawing, 23,036 applications were on file to be included in the lottery.

OREGON TO HAVE 10,000 TONS OF SUPERPHOSPHATE

Approximately 10,000 tons of 20 per cent superphosphate will be available for Oregon participants in the AAA program during 1941, as a result of arrangements completed by the State AAA office at Corvallis with national officials of the program.

These conservation materials will be available for distribution on much the same basis as has been in force this year. Cooperators may obtain the phosphate and have the cost deducted from their benefit earnings at the end of the season. Superphosphate is one of a number of conservation materials distributed as an aid to the establishment and production of legumes, grasses and other soil conserving crops.

While the actual price has not been definitely determined, it is known that it will be comparable from a value standpoint with that charged for the higher test treble phosphate this year. In addition to its phosphorus, superphosphate is worth about \$6 a ton for its gypsum content. The superphosphate is being shipped to Portland by boat and will be available for distribution after January 1. Details may be obtained from any county AAA office.

This year 4823 tons of the treble phosphate were distributed through the AAA organization, which is far more than has ever before been used in Oregon in a similar period.

SNOW SURVEY WORK TO BE EXPANDED BY SCS STAFF

Snow survey work throughout Oregon followed by water supply forecasts will be continued under the division of irrigation of the Soil Conservation service the same as for the past several years, according to word from R. A. Work, federal engineer stationed at the Medford branch experiment station and in charge of surveys for the past several years.

Because the task of gathering information on winter sports area snow and weather conditions has been turned over to the weather bureau, many have the impression that the snow survey work has been discontinued, says Work. W. W. McLaughlin, chief of the division of irrigation, has just issued a statement assuring all inquiries that the survey work is even being extended to additional water sheds and to more consideration of ground water conditions.
