Grovers Win Final
Grid Game by the
Slaughter Route

The Cottage Grove Lions literally slaughtered the Junction City Tigers in the annual Thanksgiving clash last Thursday on Kelly field by a score of 26-0.

The Junction City coach featured mass substitutions and it looked as though, when the first team didn't click, they put in the second. When the seconds didn't work, they put in the third, and when they didn't work—well, there just wasn't any more.

The first Lion touchdown came in the first quarter after a long steady drive toward the Tiger goal where Jones plunged over and McKibben kicked the extra point. The second came a few minutes later when a Jones to McKibben pass clicked and "Mike" outran his interference for the touchdown. McKibben's kick was again good. The third touchdown came in the second quarter after a pass to George Dugan on a tackle play put the ball on the 4-yard line and McKibben smashed his way to pay dirt. Jones' kick was low.

After a scoreless third quarter the frantic Tigers filled the air with passes, but they threw one too many. Tom Jones intercepted on his own 35 and ran to the fifty where he lateraled to George Dugan, who, without being touched, galloped all the way to pay dirt for his first and the game's last touchdown.

The Cottage Grove Lions placed four men on the Lane-Douglas all-star team, the biggest percentage of players placed, and gained honors by having the only repeater in the league, Bud McCoy, and the only underclassman, Howard Jenkins.

On the first team, Darrell McKibben gained a berth at halfback; Howard Jenkins was placed at guard; George Dugan at tackle, Bud McCoy again at center.

Phillips was placed at end on the second team and Tommy Jones at quarterback. Left end John Seagoe was the only Lion to place on the third team. Norman Aubrey and John Minor gained honorable mention at tackle and halfback respectively.

COUNTY BUDGET

The Lane county budget was passed Monday at Eugene with only about twelve taxpayers on hand at the public hearing. The budget provides for a levy of 12.6 mills against 17 mills for 1940 and 21 mills for 1939, the lowest in at least a dozen years.

The committee who prepared the budget included J. H. Chambers of Cottage Grove, Cal Young, Angus Gibson, E. H. Petersen and County Judge Clinton Hurd.

A new tax modernization system is being installed in the county assessor's office and the office of the tax collector. A total of \$14,500 for the new system is included in the budget. Major reduction in the budget was credited to the amount of cash on hand.

Soy Beans Versatile

The University of California, home economics department, has discovered a new use for soy beans. It is the manufacture of a substitute egg white. It is made from waste soy bean substance and can be used for making mayonnaise, whips, pie fillings and meringues and candles. The shutting off of imported egg powder from China due to the China-Japanese war created a need for egg white substitutes.

American farm cash income for the first three months of 1940 was 12 per cent higher than in the corresponding period a year ago—a total of \$1,987,000,000 as compared to \$1,773,000,000, the agricultural department reports.

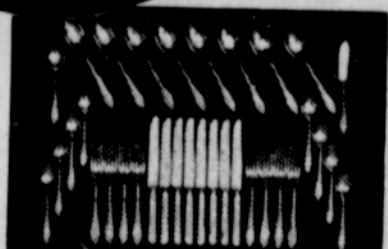
