Starchless Spuds

Stylish stouts have voted unanimously to strike off a medal in honor of the humanitarian who has developed starchless potatoes. Topatoes grow from the roots of the plants like ordinary potatoes; also produce tomatoes on the bushy tops. They feed on magnesium sulphate and six other chemicals.

HEADLIGHT LAWS ARE IMPORTANT TO DRIVER.

The Oregon laws regarding automobile headlights are as important to the motorist as any other part of the motor vehicle code according to the Oregon State Motor association.

All cars equipped with multiple-beam headlights are required to use the lower-level beams when approaching within 500 feet of an oncoming vehicle. Every new car equipped with multiple-beam lamps must have an indicator readily visible which will show which beam is being used.

Headlights must be burning when the car is in use from a half-hour after sunset until a half-hour before sunrise and at any other time when there is not sufficient light to render persons and vehicles clearly discernible at a distance of 500 feet ahead.

Flashing lights are not allowed on any private vehicle except as warning signals that a turn is about to be made. For all practical purposes this means that a motorist driving in a city or any heavily traveled highway should keep his lights on the low beam at all times.

Paprika Seed

Paprika seed may soon become an important U. S. crop. Imported from Europe, the seed has been planted on several hundred farms in Louisiana. If experiment is successful, southern farmers may grow much of 6,000,000 pounds of paprika usually imported each year.

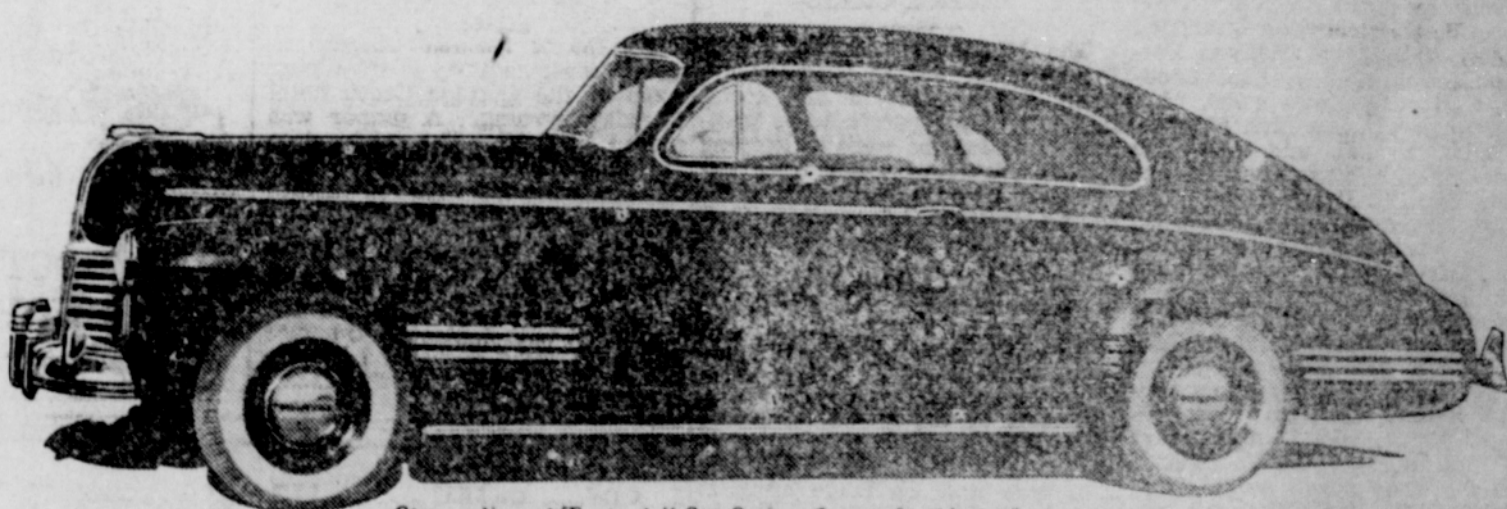

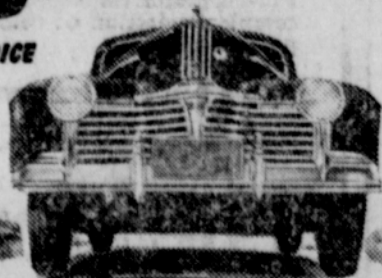
