NOTICE OF PROPOSED CHANGE FOR FIRE LIMIT.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN That the Common Council of the City of Cottage Grove proposes to pass Ordinance No. 1215 amending Section 3 of Ordinance No. 1022, passed by the Common Council and approved by the Mayor on October 14, 1929, and relating to the erection, construction, enlargement, alteration, repair, moving, removal, demolition, conversion, occupancy, equipment, use, height, area, and maintenance of buildings and/or structures in the City of Cottage Grove, Oregon, providing for the issuance of permits and collection of fees therefor, and changing the boundaries of fire zone one to read as follows, to-wit:

Section 3: That the entire Incorporated Area of the City of Cottage Grove is hereby declared to be and is hereby established as a Fire District and said Fire District shall be known and designated as Fire Zone One (1) and Two (2), and shall correspond to Zones Two (2) and Three (3), as referred to in the said "Uniform Building Code" aforesaid. The said Fire Zone One (1) shall include the following territory, to-wit:

Beginning at the center line of right of way of the Southern Pacific Railroad where the same is intersected by the North line of Washington Avenue, run thence West along said North line of Washington Avenue to the East bank of Coast Fork River, thence down the East bank of said Coast Fork River to a point due west of the south line of Whiteaker Avenue, thence East along said south line of Whiteaker Avenue and said line extended to the center line of the right of way of the Southern Pacific Railroad, thence southwestwardly along said center of right of way to the point of beginning.

Beginning at the northeast corner of the intersection of Seventh Street and Washington Avenue and running thence South to the South line of Adams Avenue, thence West to the West line of Seventh Street, thence South to the North line of Jefferson Avenue, thence West to the East line of Sixth Street, thence South to the South line of Madison Avenue, thence West to the East line of Fifth Street, thence South to the North line of Quincy Avenue, thence East to the easterly right of way line of the Southern Pacific Railroad, thence northeasterly along the easterly right of way line of the Southern Pacific Railroad to the North line of Washington Avenue, thence West along the North line of Washington Avenue to the point of beginning.
