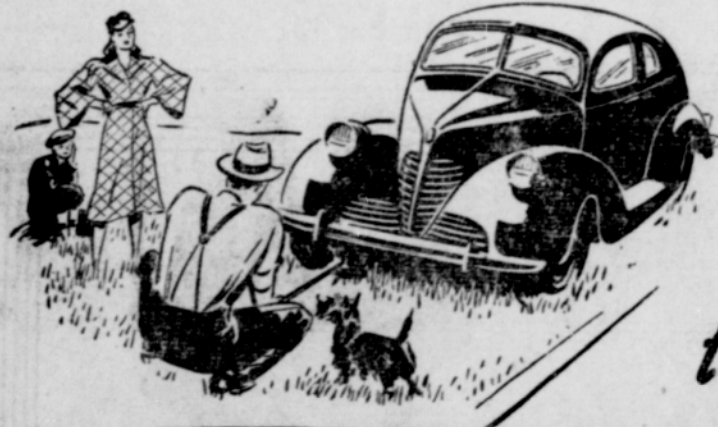

## Lumber Facts

SEATTLE, WASHINGTON. — The weekly average of West Coast lumber production in March (4 weeks) was 169,108,000 board feet, or 106.2 per cent of estimated capacity. Orders averaged 181,135,000 b.f.; shipments, 170,041,000. Weekly averages for February were: production, 167,196,000 b.f. (84.9 per cent of the 1926-1929 average); orders, 165,056,000; shipments, 158,602,000.

Thirteen weeks of 1941, cumulative production, 2,095,692,000 b.f.; same period, 1940—1,664,348,000; 1939—1,443,056,000.

Orders for 13 weeks of 1941 break down as follows: rail, 1,097,130,000 b.f.; domestic cargo, 697,521,000; export, 55,226,000; local 274,538,000.

The industry's unfilled order file stood at 745,768,000 b.f. at the end of March; gross stocks at \$85,438,000.

The sustained drive of the West Coast lumber industry over production peaks above its everyday limits was carried on in March to meet widespread and diversified defense demand. Buying for cantonment construction has receded, but orders for boatbuilding material, piling, heavy timbers and staging for new shipyards, housing and industrial items for new defense-industry projects, and for railroad material, continue to strain the cutting capacity of West Coast mills. The industry has responded by the addition of emergency shifts on some normal single-shift operations and with many new small mills.

In the normal commercial trade field of West Coast lumber, yard buying was spotty during March. The trend of permits for new residential building was downward in February. Defense housing features the home-building market.

## News Briefs

Measles led the list of communicable diseases reported for the first quarter of the year to the Lane county health department, according to figures released last Thursday, with 285 cases listed.

SAN FRANCISCO.—The navy Thursday completed arrangements to convert Treasure Island into a naval air station with construction to begin at once.

The navy will occupy Treasure Island for "duration of the present emergency," after which it will revert back to the city of San Francisco.

Although it is too early for accurate prediction there is not much question but what the Dallas district will have a bumper prune crop this year. Many things may happen between now and harvest time to change the situation. At present a terrifically heavy frost would be the worst hazard.

Pre- the cigaret tax bill to the voters at the November, 1942 general election was filed with the state department Thursday afternoon by G. J. McPherson, Portland, secretary-manager of the State Retail Grocers association, it was announced at Salem.

The petition, approved as to form by the state department, was sent to the attorney general, who has 10 days to draft a ballot title. Then the sponsors will seek to get 15,866 signatures of registered voters to prevent the measure from becoming law until the next general election.

A special meeting of the Reedsport chamber of commerce was held last week to handle a rush of urgent business. Among matters taken up was that of asking the highway commission to complete the highway between Reedsport and Drain according to the original specifications.

One peculiar thing about the blossom was that the green stripe on the reverse of the white face appeared on only three of the seven petals.—Coos Bay Harbor.
