Sharp Changes In Weather to Be Anticipated

The erratic season is here say weather experts—the season when both men and machines are subject to radical temperature changes, with possible resultant damage.

Carefully studying reports of the U. S. Weather Bureau for the past 60 years, it is discovered that one may be shivering at 40 degrees during a portion of one day, and sweltering at 85, 90 or even 100 degrees just a day or two later.

There have been many high re-

ords in past years during April and May in the Pacific West, such as 80 degrees and better in Western Washington, 90 degrees in Eastern Washington, 93 in Western Oregon, 83 in Eastern Oregon, 100 in various Southern California valleys, 96 in territory tributary to San Diego, 89 in the San Francisco Bay area, 98 in Northern California, 101 in San Joaquin Valley, 105 in and better in various parts of Arizona.

This means, according to health authorities and mechanical engineers, that both men and machines must be well fortified against the damage that may be wrought in the change from winter cold to summer heat.

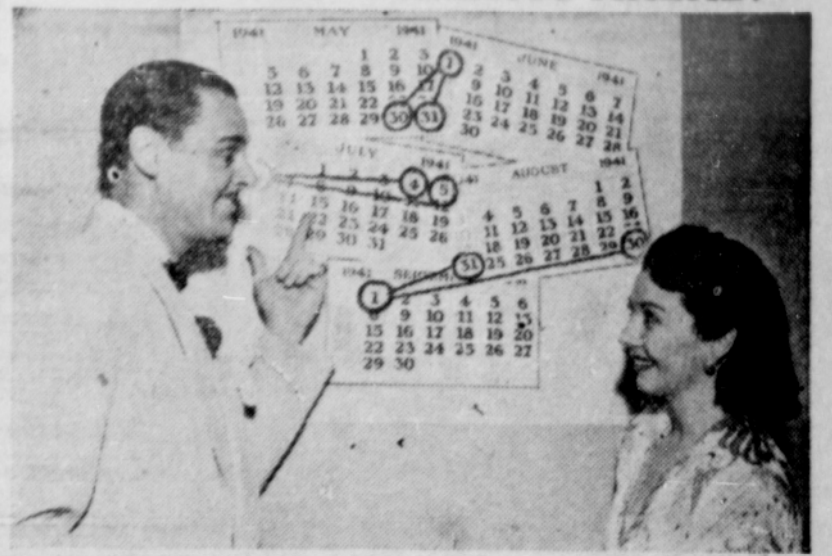
"These sharp temperature rises," says H. W. Taylor, engi-
