### HOW TO FREEZE FRUITS VEGETABLES, EXPLAINED.

Advance preparation of fruits and vegetables for freezing is one of the chief factors of success or failure in the use of storage lockers, says E. H. Wiegand, head of the food industries department at Oregon State college, in the latest revised circular on "Freezing Fruits, Vegetables, and Meats." This circular, available from any county extension office, contains general directions for handling foods in color storage and includes a tabulated list of fruits and vegetables with brief directions for handling.

In general, fruits require no preliminary treatment except washing and sorting. The exceptions are apples, peaches, and apricots, which require either pitting or peeling, and even blanching to prevent the browning of the surface. Apples and peaches are also sliced for ease in handling and better absorption of sugar. In handling vegetables scalding or blanching is an essential step in the freezing process. ## To Manufacture Synthetic Rubber

The Reconstruction Finance Corporation last week announced an appropriation of \$5,000,000 for construction of four synthetic rubber factories with a yearly capacity of 2,500 long tons each. They are to be located at B. F. Goodrich, Firestone, Goodyear and U. S. Rubber and will be designed so that yearly capacity can be stepped up quickly to 10,000 tons per unit. The RFC move highlights the brilliant record scored in synthetic rubber's first year in the automobile tire field. B. F. Goodrich, which only last June brought out the first synthetic rubber tires ever sold to the American public, now reports that several thousand of these tires "are giving satisfactory service on the highways" while several hundred leading corporations are putting them on light trucks and company cars. To dispel any overconfidence, however, it should be pointed out that the combined initial production of 10,000 tons a year is only a little more than 1% of the 725,000 long tons of crude rubber which the nation is expected to use this year. The 10,000 tons would last less than a week at the current average use of 67,271 tons per month. Private expansion of synthetic rubber produced for tires is hampered by the fact that the cost of synthetic is considerably higher than the price of natural rubber, currently 24 cents a pound. For other uses, however, the various companies have developed an estimated 1941 production of between 10,000 and 15,000 tons of oil-resistant varieties of synthetics.

### U. OF O. SCHEDULES SUMMER SESSIONS.

UNIVERSITY OF OREGON, Eugene.—Six weeks of summer school, in the heart of the Willamette valley where extra-curricular vacations may be interspersed with hours of study, is being offered by the University of Oregon thirty-seventh annual summer session beginning June 16 and continuing until July 26.

A post session of four weeks will be held from July 28 to August 22. Work in the summer sessions—for which no extra fee for out-of-state residents will be charged—is equivalent in character, method, and credit value to the work of the regular academic year.

Students will register for the six-weeks Eugene session on Monday, June 16. Classes will begin Tuesday morning, June 17, in accordance with the schedule printed in the back of the catalog and now being mailed to those who request it. Examinations will be held on Thursday and Friday, July 24 and 25. Post session registration will be on Monday, July 28.

vegetables will spoil or change so as to be undesirable.

Various kinds of containers are recommended by Professor Wiegand, including glass jars which are used in ordinary home canning operations. Lacquered tin cans with slip tops may be obtained and these are usable year after year. Waxed paper containers are suitable for use once, but are not safe to use a second time with liquids.

The circular also contains some pointers on handling meat and fish, although detailed directions for these foods are contained in another circular, HE 1100.

### CERTAIN BERRY PLANT QUARANTINES MODIFIED.

Modification of quarantines pertaining to virus diseases of loganberry, blackberry and related plants is announced by the state department of agriculture. The revisions are in line with the policy to make quarantines more reasonable wherever possible.

The revised orders deal with interstate and intrastate shipments of these berry plants and became effective June 2. Henceforth, shipments from infested territory in Oregon into the 19 virus disease-free counties may be made provided there is certification of

field inspection showing the shipments originated from disease-free plantings. Host plants from other states will be admitted on the regular certification of inspection.

The 19 protected counties are Benton, Clackamas, Clatsop, Columbia, Coos, Linn, Curry, Douglas, Hood River, Jackson, Josephine, Lane, Lincoln, Marion, Multnomah, Polk, Tillamook, Washington and Yamhill.
