

New Union Oil Co. Station to Be Opened Saturday

Herb Adams to Be in Charge of Station

Final details in the completion of the new Union Oil Company service station at 6th and Pacific highway are being rushed for the grand opening of the new station to be held Saturday, June 14th. Construction has been under way for several weeks. The station building is equipped with a two-canopy drive-in and motorists may be served either from 6th street or from the Pacific highway canopy. The building, constructed of steel, contains all the late equipment found in the modern service station, including attractively decorated restrooms with tile and chrome, the famous stop-

wear lubrication system will be featured by the new station.

Gifts for men, women, and children will be available throughout the day. The station will be under the supervision of Herb Adams who formerly operated a Union Oil Company service station on 5th street near the old highway. The building was razed several months ago to make room for the strip of new highway.

Don Greening is the wholesale agent of the Union Oil Company. The new service station represents an investment of \$10,000 by the Union Oil Company and is evidence of the faith of the company in Cottage Grove.

Speaker Tells of Proposed Hiway

Don Greening, Union Oil Company wholesale agent, accompanied by C. S. Brown of Salem, district manager, and High Matier, with the public relations department of the Union Oil Company of California, were guests at the Chamber of Commerce luncheon, Tuesday noon. Mr. Matier spoke on the possibilities of the Pan-American highway from Alaska to South America, of which highway 99 would be a part. At the conclusion of his address, Mr. Matier showed pictures of the project highway in Central and South America and also Alaska. He said:

"When completed, the projected Alaska-Argentina-Brazil Highway linking the two Americas from Fairbanks to Rio de Janeiro will go down in history as one of the greatest engineering feats of our age."

This statement was made by Hugh A. Matier, Union Oil Company's public relations representative, who is available as a speaker on the Alaska-Argentina-Brazil highway.

According to Matier, "This project will stand for all time as a fitting monument commemorating the ties of friendship that bind the two Americas irrevocably together." Matier will illustrate his talk with slide pictures, many of which he has taken himself.

A founder-member of the Pacific Geographic Society, and a patron of the Smithsonian Institute, Matier has had a personal interest in the planning of the Trans-Americas highway. In 1908, at the request of the Hon. Thomas Taylor, Canadian Minister of Lands, Matier, accompanied by the famous explorer and Indian linguist, Father Lejeune, surveyed the British Columbia section of the proposed highway. This route was surveyed along the old telegraph trail, originally blazed in 1858 to carry the telegraph wire connecting New York and London. This telegraph trail was abandoned with the successful laying of the Trans-Atlantic cable.

Well known as a dynamic and forceful speaker, Matier has won wide recognition for his archaeological achievements. He has recently been elected a fellow in the Royal Geographical Society and has for many years been a fellow of the Royal Anthropological Institute, and a member of the Canadian Archaeological Society.

Barbecued Veal Balls.
¾ pound ground veal shoulder
¾ pound ground pork shoulder
1 tablespoon minced onion
1 teaspoon salt
½ cup dry bread crumbs
½ cup milk
1 egg, beaten
Mix all ingredients together and form into balls. Place in baking pan, cover with barbecue sauce and bake in oven of 375 degrees F. for 35 minutes.

2 sprigs chives, diced
½ cup whipped cream
1 tablespoon Roquefort cheese, finely chopped
French dressing
Paprika
Romaine
Mayonnaise dressing
Salt and pepper

Marinate cold diced lamb with French dressing. Drain and combine with pineapples, chives and seasoning. Chill and just before serving mix with mayonnaise which has been thinned with the whipped cream and flavored with Roquefort cheese. Toss until well mixed, then heap on crisp romaine or lettuce leaves. Arrange pineapple slices around it and decorate with radish roses.

News Briefs

New Laws Effective.
Next Saturday, Oregon people will have a total of 387 new laws to keep when the statutes, enacted by the 1941 legislature becomes effective.

Two laws may be up for referendum; the 2% cigarette tax bill and the bill prohibiting fishing in certain coastal waters if sufficient signatures are secured for them.

The school for agricultural conservation supervisors was held in Eugene last Thursday to instruct them in this spring check of compliance under the 1941 program.

Timely Recipes

Lamb Patties

2 pounds lean lamb, ground
6 slices bacon
2 eggs, slightly beaten
1 cup bread crumbs
1 cup milk
6 fresh mushrooms
6 slices pineapple
2 tablespoons butter
Salt and pepper.

Season the ground lamb with salt and pepper. Add the slightly beaten eggs. Soak bread crumbs in milk for a few minutes, then add them to the meat. Mix thoroughly and shape into round cakes. Wrap each with a slice of bacon and fasten with a skewer or toothpicks. Broil or panbroil on both sides. Brown the pineapple slices and mushrooms in butter. Serve a lamb patty on each pineapple slice and top with mushrooms.

Strawberry Milk Shake.

1 quart strawberries
½ cup granulated sugar
2½ cups chilled milk
1 tbsp lemon juice
Crush the berries with a wooden spoon. There should be two cups of crushed berries. Add sugar and lemon juice and chill. When
