Scott Opens New Harvey Addition; Fifth Residence on Site Finished

James A. Scott is finishing his 31st residence since coming to Cottage Grove about 10 years ago. The 31st house is located on the Harvey addition about a mile northeast of Cottage Grove, being the 5th house to be finished since the addition was laid out several months ago.

Mr. Scott, who came here from California, has probably built and sold more houses than any man in south Lane county and perhaps in the county itself. In the past 20 years he has constructed and sold about 100 dwellings and he has built residences in practically all of the sections of the country surrounding Cottage Grove and seven in the city.

In the Cedar Park, commonly known as the Steel Bridge community on Row river, Mr. Scott has constructed 12 homes and plans to build several more houses on this tract of land which consists of 56 acres.

On the Harvey addition which consists of 50 acres, 25 to 45 more residences are being planned. Residences constructed by Mr. Scott have been mostly of the smaller type of house which contains 4 or 5 rooms. Recently there has been some demand for larger houses of the 6 to 7 room type.

Mr. Scott started building houses here in 1932 and so far has sold every house built. His houses are being offered on FHA terms.
