1941 Rodent Contest Awards Announced

H. C. Kuehner, county club agent, announced the results of the 1941 rodent control contest. Total number of rodents caught in the contest was 9,432. Each of the three districts in the county received a half scholarship to the Fall Creek 4-H summer camp, each having a total score of 1,500 or more and in addition a number of jack knives were awarded. In the western Lane district the Portage district had the highest score of any club with a total of 44,525 points. In the northern district or district 2, the Deerhorn district won with a total of 101,675 points. In the southern Lane district, the Lorane club had the highest score with a total of 65,100 points. Among the southern Lane members to win jack knives for scoring 15,000 or more points were: John Briggs, Lorane; Jack Van Hovel, London; Garland Hocker, Dorena; Everett Yearous, La-tum; Eugene Hart, Creswell; Delmar Benson, Saginaw; Clyde Gilham, London.

CITY GETS PANZER UNIT AFTER HORNET'S NEST.

Mrs. Glennie Frost at 6th and Adams had a troublesome hornet's nest on her property and requested the help of the city in getting rid of the nest. The matter was referred to the police department, who are more or less accustomed to dealing with hornet's nests in the figurative sense and the request was turned over to the fire department. GRANGE SAFETY PROGRAM.

The traffic safety division of the state department will furnish educational material for Oregon Granges participating in the National Grange Traffic Safety program this year, it was announced yesterday.

Oregon Granges plan to enter their safety contest and in addition they will sponsor safety essay contests for school children in the state. Winners in the Grange contest receive cash prizes and winners in the essay contest receive cash prizes and trips.

In 1939, the Hermiston Grange won an award of \$100 for the best safety program in the nation. In 1940, however, no prizes were won by Oregon Granges.

News Briefs

Two selective service boards of Lane county will send forty-eight selectees to Portland for induction in the army July 9th and 22nd, it was announced Saturday. Board No. 3 will send twenty-six men on July 9th and board No. 2 will send 22 men on July 14th.

The Ford Motor Company Saturday ended its forty-four year old fight against the United Auto Workers and signed a comprehensive agreement with the C.I.O. organization.

Pat Harrison, senior senator from Mississippi, senate president pro tem and chairman of the finance committee, died Sunday in a Washington, D. C., hospital following an intestinal obstruction. Harrison, aged 59, a member of the senate for the past thirty years, was buried at Gulfport, Mississippi yesterday.

In two major moves, the War Department Saturday at Washington acted to revitalize its air corps and recommended that national guardsmen and reserve officers be kept on active duty indefinitely to provide a maximum training nucleus for the rapidly-expanding citizen army.

A defense official rated the value of the Nazi war machine Friday "in excess of \$100,000,000,000," and said that the United States might have to pour out a comparable amount before Germany was beaten.

SPEED LAW BULLETIN OUT.

UNIVERSITY OF OREGON, Eugene—A detailed bulletin on the new Oregon speed law which became effective June 14, containing the act and just how it works, has been prepared and distributed by the League of Oregon Cities, it was announced here by Herman Kohrli, executive secretary of the league and head of the University of Oregon bureau of municipal research.

The new store location, formerly occupied by Knickerbocker's 5c to \$1.00 store, has been repainted and redecorated preparatory to the change.

Lester Brisbane said yesterday the electric store would have much more room than in the former quarters at 401 Main and would devote more time and space to the proper display of electrical merchandise. The new store location is larger and we expect to add a larger stock of merchandise, he said.

No announcement has been made as to who would occupy the building vacated by Brisbane at 401 Main street.

Logged-Off Lands Impress Visitors

The sight of cattle and sheep grazing over 700 acres of excellent grass on the Northrup creek logged-off land grazing experiment greatly impressed agronomists from the western states and USDA officials from Washington, D. C., who visited the area at the conclusion of the western section agronomy meeting at Oregon State college.

Dr. O. A. Aamodt, in charge of the work with forage crops and diseases for the USDA, said the results of the Northrup creek research work may have national as well as regional significance. Other areas in this country, particularly those around the Great Lakes, are faced with a similar problem of utilizing logged-off lands during the period of reforestation or of deciding when logged-off lands are of more value for grazing than for forests. Conditions around the Great Lakes are so similar to those along the west coast that even some of the forage plant results here may be applicable there, he said.

Soil conservation service representatives who made the tour were particularly impressed with the excellent sod cover obtained even on steep slopes, which stands up well under grazing.

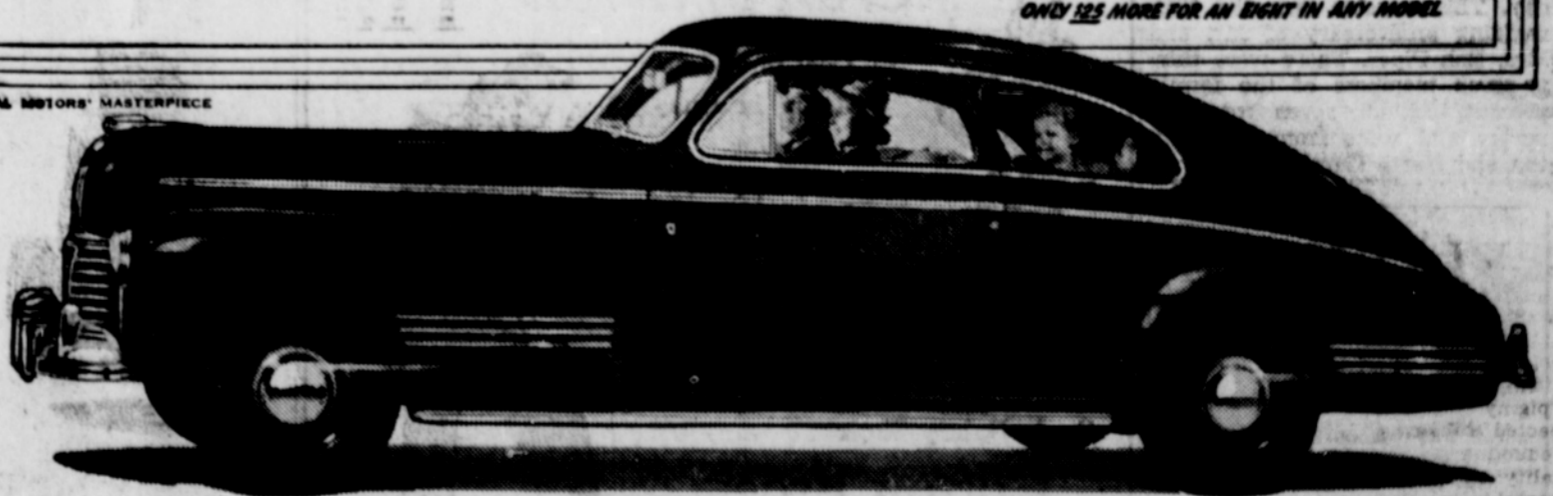
