

National Civilian Defense Councils Being Organized

SALEM, Oregon, July 8.—Oregon's contribution to national civilian defense has begun with the enrollment of volunteers to serve in the civil reserves in each county in the state, following organization of county defense councils this past month. Jerrold Owen, state civilian defense coordinator, said today. Most of the enrollment drives will be concluded by the middle of July.

One of the first appointments requested of the local defense councils following their organization is that of the chairman to be in charge of the aircraft warning service, with whom United States army officials may establish contact. Several thousand volunteers will be required to man observation posts throughout the state. A post will be established in each six square miles and on duty at each of these posts will be 16 observers to be given intensive training by the army. Location of the posts and selection of the personnel from the civil reserves list will be the responsibility of the man selected by the defense council as county chairman of the aircraft warning service.

Observation posts will report to filter centers, at Eugene, Roseburg, and Portland and at the latter city, information centers will transmit essential data to anti-aircraft defense units and squadrons of fighter planes.

Another immediate objective of the county defense councils is the organization of drives for the collection of scrap aluminum, declared Owen. This is in response to an appeal from Mayor F. H. LaGuardia, national director of civilian defense, who has fixed July 21 as the opening date of a national campaign which is expected to salvage enough aluminum to build 2,000 airplanes.

Owen suggests that county defense councils select a veteran group or civic organization to head and organize the campaign in each county, utilizing Boy and Girl Scouts and 4-H clubs for the actual work of collection.

Russian Army Holding Germans

Russia declared Thursday that her big red army fighting for survival on a front extending from the Arctic circle to the Black sea steadily was sapping the striking power of the German war machine which has overrun nearly all of Europe.

Violent battles still surged inconclusively along the entire front with the Germans and Finns claiming slight gains in the direction of Leningrad and Kandalaksha, railway point south of the Soviet arctic port of Murmansk.

Adolph Hitler, editor of the Nazi high command's communiqués, limited himself to a statement that "the fights continue successful on the entire eastern front." German reporters, however, said several Estonian villages had been occupied along with Qastrov, Russian city near the Latvian border.

This latter area was the scene of bitter fighting as the Germans tried to break through toward Leningrad. Here the Soviets said their troops were stubbornly "pounding back the advance of superior German forces."

Officials Surprised
For the first time since the Nazi-Soviet battle started, army officials at Washington Wednesday expressed surprise at what they deemed the excellent showing made by the Russians thus far. It was believed that, if present indications are maintained, that this may be a long war, the U. S. S. R. may expect considerable armaments aid from the United States.

Outstanding Men To Visit Pageant

EUGENE, July 8 (Special)—Two outstanding men in Oregon government, Governor Charles Sprague and State Treasurer Leslie Scott, have been asked to be honored guests at Eugene's Oregon Trail Pageant, July 24, 25 and 26, with both likely to accept, it was disclosed today by George P. Hitchcock, business manager of the Pageant celebration.

The governor has been asked to lead the civic and industrial parade, gigantic opening-day spectacle, and also to crown Queen Susannah V, gracious ruler of the three-day epic of the west. State Treasurer Scott will be grand marshal of the Pioneer parade, over a mile of non-motor drawn floats passing in review.

Who Governor Sprague will crown in fitting western ceremony is yet to be decided. A queen's contest, with six sparkling belles, scion of pioneer families, competing is being conducted, with the queen to be proclaimed July 12 upon tabulation of votes cast by the entire populace of Lane county. Six beautiful Lane county lassies are entered, with five to be princesses in Queen Susannah's royal court.

Escorting the governor when he comes to Eugene for pageant festivities will be the mounted governor's posse, composed of 25 riders in resplendent uniforms.

Eugene itself is rapidly becoming pageant conscious, with all males boasting heavy black beards and both men and women wearing pioneer costumes of their forefathers, with hoop skirts, tennish hats, and cowboy boots standard raiment.

Nat'l Guardsmen Will Be Retained

President Roosevelt announced at Washington Tuesday it is necessary, in the interests of American military efficiency, to retain draftees, national guardsmen and regular troops in continuous training and service for duration of the emergency.

Withdrawal of draftees and guardsmen from integrated units of the Army after one year's service would reduce efficiency of the Army at a time when success in modern warfare depends upon the independent abilities of each army unit, the chief executive said.

Indirect assurance that American soldiers need not be sent into Europe's war was given earlier by presidential secretary Stephen Early.

To explain his position, Mr. Roosevelt cited the example of an anti-aircraft regiment in Hawaii,

Alaska, Panama, Bermuda, Trinidad or Newfoundland, from which he said a large proportion of present manpower would be brought home soon under existing law. This demobilization of all but regular troops would seriously deplete such a garrison, he said, and reduce its military power.
