New Soilless Plant May Be Grown

PHOENIX, Ariz.—Experts predict that Phoenix and the "Valley of the Sun" in which it is located soon may be the soilless farming capital of the nation.

Ernest Brundin of Montebello, California, scientist who developed soil-less farming on a mass production basis and planned commercial use of the method, said the Phoenix area offered ideal conditions for the proposed new industry.

The revolutionary new farming method adapts itself easily to culture of vegetables, Brundin explained. He expressed hopes to produce vegetables out of season that would bring good prices on eastern markets.

Roots of the vegetables are immersed in glass tanks filled with water to which chemicals are added in the combinations to produce the best growth.

The scientific balance of elements is needed to bring out luxurious foliage, strong roots and better fruit. Approximately half again as many plants are produced on a given surface of the

soilless nutrient solution as on an equivalent area of soil, Brundin estimated.

In experimenting with tomatoes over a 12-month period, scientists found that the height of the vine and size of the tomato was considerably increased. There was no noticeable difference, however, in vitamin and mineral contents.

Brundin said present methods make it too expensive to produce vegetables on a large scale, and no competition will be offered field crops. When the method is perfected, however, labor costs will be one third lower than those for soil operation and fertilization and water costs will be about 35 per cent lower.

Soil-less farming was discovered in 1859 and perfected in 1864 by German and Dutch scientists. It was not commercialized, however, until 15 years ago by Dr. W. F. Gericke.

FRESH VEGETABLES ON FOOD STAMP PLAN.

During July all fresh vegetables available on local markets can be purchased with blue stamps by families taking part in the Federal food stamp plan, according to announcement made today by Louis Belangle, area supervisor of the Surplus Marketing Administration.

More than 60,000 public assistance families in Oregon participate in the plan, and by placing all fresh vegetables on the blue stamp list, it is expected that considerable increase in the consumption of seasonal local surpluses of perishable truck crops will result.

REPLACE RADIATOR HOSES.

Radiator hoses should be replaced before they start rotting, suggests the Emergency Road Service of the Oregon State Motor association. Outwardly a hose may look perfect, but hot water causes the inside to deteriorate first. If allowed to go too long without changing, the hoses may sluff off particles of rubber and fiber that work their way into the radiator core, blocking circulation and causing the engine to over-heat.

NEW MEN ASSIGNED TO FOREST SERVICE.

Two transfers to the North Pacific Region of the forest service, U. S. department of agriculture, have just been made, according to Arnold R. Standing, assistant regional forester at Portland.

Charles A. Rindt has just been assigned to the planting and nursery section of timber management, and Walter G. Thomson has

been assigned to field studies and management plans in the division of state and private forestry.
