Many of the land owners under the dam have either sold or have their property ready for sale to the government.

O. AND C. LANDS TO BE RESEED.

A favorable report of a committee on the question of reseeding cutover O. and C. lands and all county owned lands of that nature was received at a meeting of the O. and C. land grant committee in Portland Saturday. County Commissioners Walter J. Holland and Allen P. Wheeler of Lane County, who attended the meeting, reported Monday. Reseeding these lands for pasture would be paid out of the O. and C. funds received by the different counties from the federal government if the plan is adopted.

\$30,000 GRADE SCHOOL BUILDING FOR ELKTON

Work will start soon on a new \$30,000 grade school building for Elkton. The Elkton school board, meeting last week awarded a contract to Tom Lillabo of reedsport for the structure of the building to be made of wood. BIG LAMB CROP

WASHINGTON — The agriculture department reported Saturday the 1941 lamb crop was the largest on record, totaling 34,549,000 head, an increase of 5 per cent over the previous record crop of 1940 and 13 per cent more than the ten-year period from 1930-39 average.

Better Morale Is Theme of Broadcast Over West Coast

Defending the nation through a higher standard of living, a better morale, and an increased capacity for self-support of the disadvantaged farm families of the Pacific northwest will be discussed by Elmer Hoffnauer, administrative assistant for farm security administration, in west coast radio broadcast over western agriculture, August 1 at 7 a. m. PST, announces Robert W. Schmidt, county FSA supervisor of Eugene.

Mr. Hoffnauer will give a report of progress made during 1940, by over 11,000 standard borrower families, including 110 families in Lane county, who have been cooperating in the department of agriculture's Farm Security program in Washington, Oregon and Idaho. The report will include progress made in the farm security program. Loans, loan repayments, live-at-home program, community and cooperative services, debt adjustment, purchasing and health associations, are among the things which will be discussed, Mr. Schmidt said.

Formation of a state wide committee of forty citizens to have charge of a defense bond sale drive was announced Saturday at Portland, it was announced by Palmer Hoyt, state chairman. 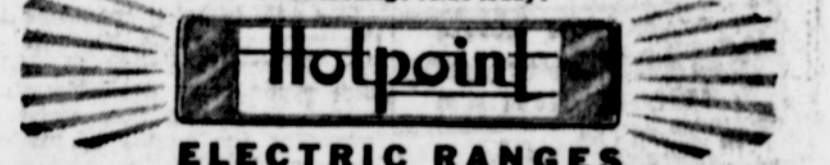
