CHRISTIAN SCIENCE CHURCHES

"LIFE" was the subject of the Lesson-Sermon in all Churches of Christ, Scientist, on Sunday, July 29.

The Golden Text was, "The Lord will command his loving kindness in the daytime, and in the night his song shall be with me, and my prayer unto the God of my life" (Ps. 42:8).

Among the citations which comprised the Lesson-Sermon was the following from the Bible: "Thus saith the Lord the King of Israel, and his redeemer the Lord of hosts; I am the first, and I am the last; and beside me there is no God" (Isa. 44:6).

The Lesson-Sermon also included the following correlative passages from the Christian Science textbook, "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures" by Mary Baker Eddy: "Question—What is Life? Answer—Life is divine Principle, Mind, Soul, Spirit. Life is without beginning and without end. Eternity, not time, expresses the thought of Life, and time is no part of eternity. One ceases to proportion as the other is recognized. Time is finite; eternity is forever infinite. Life is neither in nor of matter. What is termed matter is unknown to Spirit, which includes in itself all substance and is Life eternal. Matter is a human concept. Life is divine Mind. Life is not limited. Death and finiteness are unknown to Life. If Life ever had a beginning, it would also have an ending" (pp. 468, 469).

1800 LATIN FIRMS BLACK-LISTED.

President Roosevelt Friday launched a smashing counter-offensive to the Axis "economic blitzkrieg" in the western hemisphere by outlawing further U. S. trade with more than 1,800 business firms and individuals in Latin America.

The President's executive order also froze all funds of the black-listed firms and individuals in this country.

The outlawed firms were named in an official "blacklist" which was promulgated by the State Department and other government agencies under direction of the President.

The White House branded them as "persons deemed to be acting for the benefit of Germany or Italy" whose activities are "detrimental to the interests of national defense."

The drastic action was the signal for the start of full-scale U. S. economic warfare against the Axis powers.

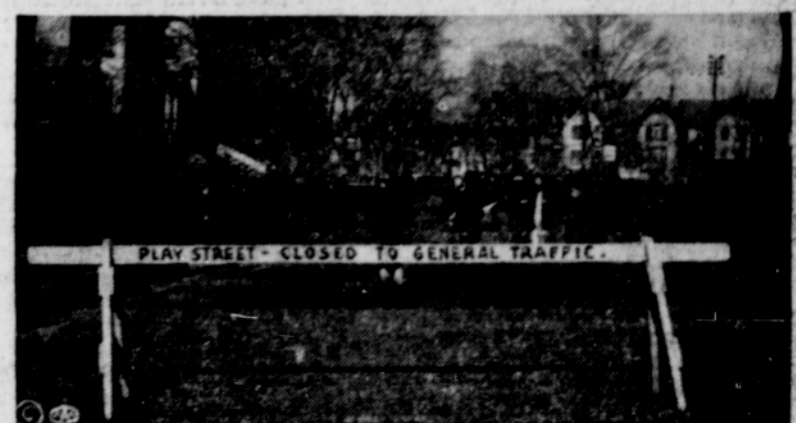
Camels for Warfats

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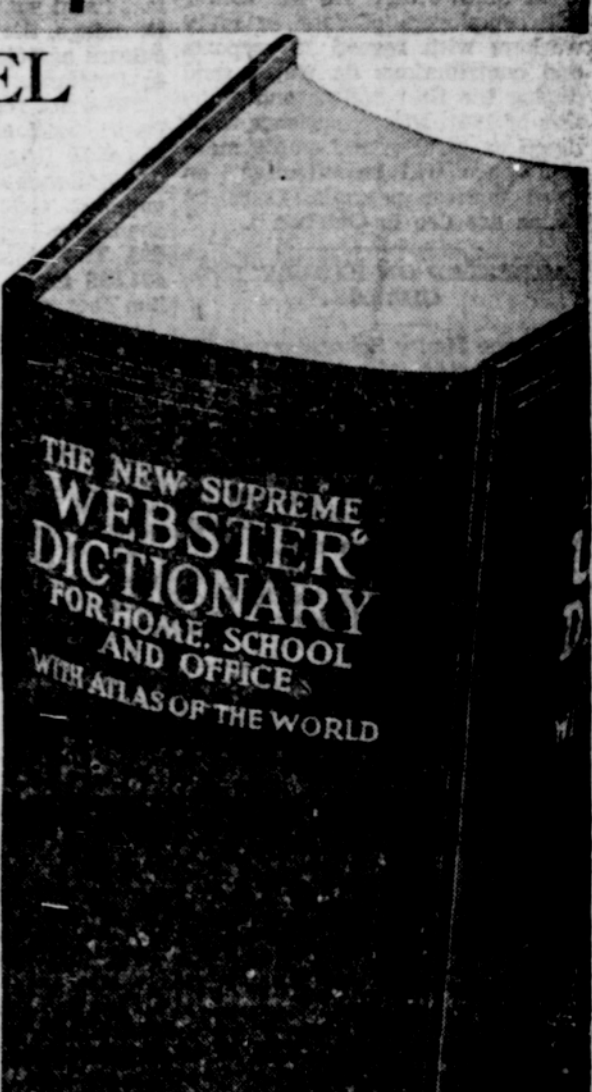
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
